## From the Pastor's Desk.....

In today's gospel we hear about a feast. In the parable there are two sons who both, in their own way, hurt their father: the first, by his selfcentred behaviour, the other, by refusing to celebrate his brother's return. But in spite of this the father shows nothing but love and solicitude. He invites them both to a feast. It is a feast of reconciliation. The Eucharistic, among other things, is also a feast of reconciliation. For in the Mass we are called to be reconciled to one another and to God in this banquet that expresses our unity.

After the Eucharistic Prayer the assembly stands to pray the Lord's Prayer which is followed by the Sign of Peace. These two actions help prepare us for Communion by reminding us of the intrinsic connection between Eucharist and Reconciliation. In the Lord's Prayer the fourth petition, "give us this day our daily bread" relates to the Eucharist in which we are about to partake. The fifth petition, "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us", is a reminder that of our need to be reconciled with God and one another in order that our communion be holy.

We pray to "Our Father", not "My Father..." conscious that we belong both to God and God's family. The Sign of Peace naturally follows the Lord's Prayer, reinforcing our oneness in Christ. Thus we are prepared to receive communion in its widest, deepest and truest meaning: communion with Christ and one another.

The gospel story has both a happy and a sad ending. While the younger son *is* reconciled to his father, the younger son remains embittered and estranged. This parable is a challenge for us as followers of Jesus to be ambassadors of God's reconciliation through our own practice of reaching out in healing love. May our celebration of the Eucharistic be for us a source of peace and reconciliation.

#### Weekly Reflection:

#### **Understanding God's Grace**

In a masterful book on grace, Piet Fransen suggests that we can test how well we understand grace by gauging our reaction to this story:

Imagine a man who during his whole life is entirely careless about God and morality. He's selfish, ignores the commandments, ignores all things religious, and is basically consumed with pursuing his own pleasure – wine, sex, and song. Then, just hours before his death, he repents of his irresponsibility, makes a sincere confession, receives the sacraments of the church, and dies inside that conversion.

What's our spontaneous reaction to that story? Isn't it wonderful that he received the grace of conversion before he died? Or, more likely: The lucky beggar! He got away with it! He got to have all that pleasure and still gets to go to heaven!

If we felt the latter emotion, even for a moment, we have never deeply understood the concept of grace. Rather, like the older brother of the prodigal son, we are still seeing life away from God's house as fuller than life inside God's house, are still doing the right things mostly out of bitter duty, and are secretly envying the amoral. But, if this is true, we must be gentle with ourselves. This is an occupational hazard for good, faithful persons.

If we look back on our lives and are truly honest, we have to admit that of all the invitations that God has sent us, we've probably accepted and acted on only a fraction of them. There have been countless times we've turned away from an invitation.

Like the older brother, our problem is ultimately not the excessive love that is seemingly shown someone else. Our problem is that we have never fully heard or understood God's words: "My child, you have always been with me and all I have is yours, but we, you and I, should be happy and dance because your younger brother who was dead has come back to life!" #### GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Lk 15:1-3, 11-32

The parable of the lost son is a fascinating study of Jewish culture and purity laws. The son could not have distanced himself more from Jewish custom. Firstly, he demanded his inheritance, effectively treating his father as dead. Secondly, he travels to a pagan land and then in despair finds himself feeding pigs - animals whose meat was forbidden to Jews. He knows that his actions have alienated him from his family and culture and yet when he returns, his father gives him a fine robe and a ring to wear – signs of a father claiming a son as his own.
