From the Pastor's Desk.....

"I'm going fishing", Peter informs his friends. It's not recreational fishing Peter is speaking of, for he is a fisherman by occupation, Peter is just causally informing the others that he is going back to work. It's business as usual. After all the tumultuous events of the last days, of Jesus' arrest and execution and the mystifying encounters of the Risen Lord, one can understand Peter needing to regain some form of normality. To go back to something he is familiar with seems quite understandable.

But the Risen Lord has other plans for him. "Peter, feed my sheep". The fisherman becomes the shepherd. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, now entrusts that role to Peter. This commissioning takes place on the shores of Lake Tiberias. It is daybreak, the dawn of a new day – the overtones of the resurrection are obvious. And the subtext seems to say, "No, Peter, it's not business as usual. I have something new for you."

In the church, it can never be "business as usual". If we are truly open to the presence of the Risen Lord, then we will always be called to walk in newness of life. As a parish community we too need to be constantly moving forward, and this will often require letting go of the familiar and embracing new ways of doing things. I believe this parish has a good history of doing this, and therefore would encourage us to continue this pioneering tradition of St John's.

Weekly Reflection:

Do You Love Me?

Peter had sworn that he would never betray Jesus, even if everyone else did. He made this promise in utter sincerity, with deep love in his heart, fully intending on keeping his word. However, he broke his promise quickly in the face of adversity. Peter recognises his betrayal when Jesus looked at him with love, and he wept at his sin.

From this we learn that sincerity and good will aren't enough to keep us from sinning. Sin isn't always the product of malice or hypocrisy. More often, we sin out of simple weakness. While sincerity doesn't necessarily save us from sin, it does help us hear the rooster crow.

As long as we remain sincere, we will soon enough admit our sin and we will know too that God still looks on us with love, even in betrayal. It is a reminder to all of us that there is no act that we can perform that cannot be forgiven by God and from which we cannot come back.

The meal celebrated on the beach takes on Eucharistic overtones and the community gathered, the nucleus of the Church will celebrate and experience in the Eucharist the on-going hospitality of God that the disciples have received from Jesus.

With Jesus no longer physically present the role of the Good Shepherd, who laid down his life for the sheep entrusted to him by the Father will fall to Simon Peter but first his qualifications must be probed and tested.

Hence the triple, solemn interrogation to which Jesus submits him: 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?' (21:15-19). Only if Simon loves Jesus 'more than these others' will he be suitable to take up the pastoral role which Jesus has exercised to the point of death.

The triple protestation of love will more than adequately compensate for the past failure and show that Peter is ready and equipped to feed and tend the sheep, as Jesus had done.

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Jn 21:1-19

When the disciples drag ashore their miraculous haul of fish, the gospel writer tells us that there were 153 fish! This seems an odd number and an odd fact to specifically mention. Mathematically, 153 is a number with several interesting attributes, and historically, it has been suggested that the ancients believed that there were 153 species of fish or 153 nations in the world. Like nearly every number used in the Bible, its meaning is symbolic, not literal. It is intended to convey that the catch of fish was huge and is indicative of the vast numbers of people who will be caught up in the disciples' new ministry.
