From the Pastor's Desk......

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. And kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth.

I have always been especially fond of this traditional prayer. With a few deft strokes the anonymous author of this short prayer seems to capture all the fierce and tender passion of the Holy Spirit. This fire, this love, this divine energy is what drives the universe. The church needs to be constantly renewed so that it might radiate this love to a world so often indifferent, cold and shallow.

The feast of Pentecost reminds us of the importance of the Holy Spirit in the life of the church. It is through the Spirit that we are empowered to carry on the mission of Jesus to bring healing and new hope.

Next week 36 children of our parish will be confirmed by the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Adolfo Yllana. We are fortunate that the celebration of Confirmation coincides with the feast of Pentecost. It is said that as Baptism stands in relation to Easter, so Confirmation stands in relation to Pentecost.

Weekly Reflection:

The Power & love of the Holy Spirit

We know, from our own experience and from the first Pentecost that the Spirit works in unpredictable AND ordinary ways. From the Acts of the Apostles we learn that where the Spirit of God is active all sorts of gifts are present:

- boldness to stand up for what we believe;
- the ability to hear and listen;
- an end to fear that locks us in on ourselves;
- confidence in the salvation won for us in Christ;
- fidelity to Jesus' commandment to love;
- clarity about what's true; and
- 'feeling at home' with God.

The problem for many of us is working out where the Holy Spirit is leading us. This requires the gift of the discernment of spirits.

St Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, left the church a guide for working out how we can tell if and where the Holy Spirit is leading us. One summary of them goes like this:

- 1. Don't make a decision when you're down. Let the crisis pass and take time to weigh all the options.
- 2. The Holy Spirit enables us to let go of our unhealed past and not live in the unknown future. The Holy Spirit draws us to deal with the here and now, as it is, not as we may like it to be.
- 3. The Holy Spirit frees us up to bring out into the open anything we keep buried in the dark. There is nothing that has ever happened to us that is beyond the Spirit's healing.
- 4. The Holy Spirit breaks down isolation and draws us into community with other people.
- 5. Be careful of things that appear too perfect, they sometimes have a sting in the tail and can be destructive.
- 6. Be guarded about all things that are urgent. The Holy Spirit brings a sense of perspective to problems.
- 7. The Holy Spirit is always present where compassion and forgiveness are demonstrated.

Not bad for a guy who died in 1556.

Pentecost is God's promise to abide with us come what may. And living in the power and love of the Spirit and claiming her direction is an intensely practical affair.

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Jn 20:19-23

The word Pentecost comes from the Greek for fiftieth day. Pentecost Sunday ends the season of Easter and comes as a Sabbath day after seven weeks of seven days. In Jewish tradition the 50th day after the Passover was celebrated as a blessina of the harvest and rather than the unleavened bread of Passover it was celebrated by leavening the bread. It was for this reason that the disciples were gathered together when they experienced the Holy Spirit empowering them. In Christian tradition, Pentecost is celebrated as the arrival of the Spirit, promised by Jesus, that animated the disciples to spread the gospel of Jesus and gather believers to form what would eventually become the Church.
