From the Pastor's Desk.....

God Is Not Great, The Atheist Manifesto, The God Delusion and other such titles are currently displayed in bookshops. They line up in a concerted attack on religion. But we've seen all this before with the atheistic push in the nineteenth century led by Nietzsche, Marx and Freud. All these arguments against religion assume that religion is a bad idea. In other words, people have been misguided. There is the suggestion that reason will eventually put pay to religion once and for all.

However, what they seem to overlook is that religion is not an ideology. It is faith. And faith is grounded in an encounter of the Other. In the monotheistic faiths, this Other, who is named God, is experienced in relationship. Christianity makes an even bolder claim that it is in the person of Jesus that we encounter God. This is a most remarkable claim, and one that can never be proved by argument alone.

Not that faith diminishes the importance of reason, as Pope John Paul II so eloquently put it: Faith and reason are like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves (Fides et Ratio, 1998)

Trinity Sunday reminds us of the central belief in a triune God. Not that we can ever explain the mystery of the Trinity, but we are invited to enter into this mystery and live it.

Weekly Reflection:

Our Triune God

Anyone who claims to understand God is deceived because the very first dogma we have about God affirms that God is ineffable. That means that we can know God, but never adequately capture God in a concept. God is unimaginable. God cannot be circumscribed and put into a mental picture of any kind. Thank goodness too. If God could be understood then God would be as limited as we are.

God is infinite. Infinity, precisely because it's unlimited, cannot be circumscribed. Hence it cannot be captured in a mental picture. Indeed, we don't even have a way of picturing God's gender. God is not a man, not a woman, and not some hybrid, half-man and half-woman. God's gender, like God's nature, is intellectually inconceivable. We can't grasp it and have no language or pronoun for it. God, is a modality beyond the categories of human thought, is somehow perfect masculinity and perfect femininity all at the same time. It's a mystery beyond us.

God may be ineffable, but God's nature is known. Nature, religion, and Jesus conspire together to reveal an Ultimate Reality, a Ground of Being, a Creator and Sustainer of the universe, a God, who is wise, intelligent, prodigal, compassionate, loving, forgiving, patient, good, trustworthy, and beautiful beyond imagination. God cannot be deciphered, or captured in human thought; but, from what can be deciphered, we're in good, safe hands.

While the Trinity is a feast that glorifies the central mystery of our faith, a mystery that is based on the way the three divine persons relate to each other, the readings all address ways that God relates to us. If we concentrate, as the texts for today suggest that we do, on all of the ways that our Triune God has blessed us, we may be more inclined to cry out with the psalmist:

'O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!'

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Jn 16:12-15

The Nicene Creed

The definitive statement of Christian belief is contained within the Nicene Creed that is proclaimed by the community in the Mass. It was developed by the Council of Nicea, held in 325, in response to a variety of teachings (some declared to be heresy) that were circulating at the time and the creed was further revised in 381. The creed declares that Jesus is 'God from God, light from light, true God from true God ... of one being with the Father' and that the Holy Spirit 'proceeds from the Father and the Son'. All of these statements seek to define the oneness of the Trinitarian God.
