From the Pastor's Desk.....

It's been over two years since we had begun the process of exploring our liturgical space with the aim of enhancing our celebration of the liturgy. We began by holding a parish assembly in which we invited Fr Stephen Hackett msc to give a presentation on the liturgical documents relating to church architecture and the celebration of the sacraments. Parishioners were then invited to form discussion groups. A follow up meeting was held for those who attended this assembly and a steering committee was formed to carry forward the recommendations of this meeting. This is not a major renovation. The main thrust of this project is to simplify the sanctuary area by having just one level for altar, ambo (lectern) and presider's chair. This will help to streamline the celebration of the liturgy and maximize the economy of space. It will also ensure greater safety compliance. The second stage of the project will be the installation of a new baptismal font in the body of the church. This is something that we urgently require.

I am grateful to Established Builders (who were previously engaged for the renovations of the toilets) and for Black Forest Joinery. They have been exceptionally helpful and generous toward us.

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This weekend we welcome Fr Brian Vale. Brian is a Columban Missionary Society Priest. He will be here to promote the magazine "The Far East". Many of you would be familiar with this popular publication. It certainly reflects Pope Francis' call to be a "church of the poor for the poor". While this is an MSC parish it is important that we welcome and support other congregations and societies working to promote the mission of the wider church. *Peace & blessings, Gerard*

Weekly Reflection:

Stewardship of the World

We are creatures of this world. We are made of it and we are totally dependent upon it for our very existence. We require its air, its water, its food, its heat. We need it for covering and for shelter; we need it to stimulate our minds and our spirits. Therefore, our use of its phenomenal resources cannot in itself be immoral. What is questionable is the character of our use.

We have the right to use and to enjoy the marvels of our world, but we cannot do this free of responsibility to each other and to the world itself. We are not called to disown the world. It is impossible for us to do that, because of our total dependence upon it. But we are called to live in it gently, using what we need and sharing what we can.

We know now that if human beings disappeared tomorrow, the existence of birds, insects, water creatures, and land animals wouldn't be affected at all. On the other hand, if animals disappeared tomorrow, human beings could not possibly live without them – as long as bees are needed even to pollinate so many plants. As the top of the food chain, we would be the first to go.

The interdependence of the species that has become so clear in our age has also shed new light on the concept of creation itself.

It is indeed time for us to begin to listen to the animals. We must begin to realise that the animals do not belong to us- they belong to God. They have lives of their own. And their lives affect ours. Whatever happens to the animals will eventually happen to the human animal.

We must make decisions as trustworthy stewards of the household of God, not like the man in the gospel who was only concerned with his own wellbeing. We must serve God, not mammon.

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GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Lk 16:1-13

We return again to the Lukan theme of money and how it can get in the way of being a true disciple. This week's gospel passage reminds us that we cannot be a follower of God and chase after riches at the same time.

To be the steward of a household or business was much more than being the manager on behalf of the owner. Stewardship was meant to stand and act in the place of the owner. It was to carry the authority and responsibility of the master or owner. When dealing with a steward it was just like dealing with the master. Jesus sometimes portrays himself as God's steward and sometimes portrays the disciples as his stewards. To be entrusted with the stewardship of anything was a great honour and carried enormous trust.
