From the Pastor's Desk......

This coming week I will begin my four week annual holiday. I will have to wait until my return to see the finished remodelling of the sanctuary area. Obviously I hadn't planned for the renovations to be taking place while I am away, it just happened to work out that way. But I'm happy with the progress so far. The workmanship of the new sanctuary is faultless. It will look very beautiful.

Over the next four weeks I will reissue a series of articles on the placement of the font, assembly, ambo and altar. I had originally published these short articles in 2014 when we first embarked on this project of relocating the ambo and presiders chair.

While away I will spend two weeks on the Camino Portugués. I will begin in Porto in Portugual and hopefully complete the pilgrimage in Santiago de Compostela in Spain. It will only be a 250 kilometre walk unlike the more familiar French Camino, which, if you left from St Jean de Pied on the French boarder, would be an 800 kilometre trek. Not being an experienced walker I've opted for the shorter walk. Still, I'll be averaging 20 kilometres a day which will be challenging enough.

My guess is that people choose to do the Camino for a number of reasons. I am certainly looking forward to some much needed exercise and taking in the local scenery. But my primary motivation is to strengthen my faith. Faith is a beautiful gift. But like any gift it can be neglected and underused. I have the great fortune to live and minister in this wonderful parish. But there is always the danger that ministry can become routine, a duty and, heaven forbid, a chore! That is why retreats and pilgrimages are so important. They help to keep alive the flame of faith.

The gospel passage today is about having faith that is deeply planted and well nourished. There are many references in the gospel to Jesus commending those who show faith: "your faith has saved you". May we as a parish continue to give witness to that faith.

Weekly Reflection:

Duty and Service

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken heart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on.

Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own. We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table.

The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God.

Our faith gives purpose and meaning to our work in the world. As difficult as it can be to love others and live peacefully, we know this is God's desire and intention for the world. Every act of kindness that we perform extends God's kingdom, nothing is too small, nothing is insignificant. If all of us lived out Christian teaching, the world would be transformed overnight. It is not that our virtues and values have been found wanting, it's more that they are not fully tried out.

To serve God in the world, in response to his invitation, is a privilege. We share in his creativity, compassion, hospitality and care. And often, through us, others come to know God and judge if Christian faith is sincere.

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL

When speaking about doing what is expected, Jesus uses the image of a servant or slave. Whilst this image may be a difficult one for us, Jesus is simply using an image that would have held meaning to his audience. The sense of doing what is expected without anticipating acclaim was best captured in the time by talking about a servant or slave. This does not suggest that Jesus condoned the practice of slavery or servitude – they were just cultural norms at the time. When Jesus spoke about these matters it was only to ensure that slave and servants were treated fairly.

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith, but their question – and the reply given by Jesus – does not make clear the faith that they want increased. Is it their faith in God; their faith in themselves; or their faith in the people they are called to serve?
