From the Pastor's Desk.....

It has hit us as a tsunami – and not just one tsunami– there has been wave upon wave. I am referring, of course, to the revelations of sexual abuse within the Catholic Church. The latest wave to hit us with such devastating impact is the wrap up of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse which is presently underway.

The Commission has set aside three weeks to: a) examine the cultural, structural and governance factors that may have contributed to sexual abuse of children in the church, b) inquire into the current policies and practices related to child protection, complaints handling and risk management, and c) consider the responses of Catholic Church Authorities to issues raised in Royal Commission reports and to data relating to claims of child sexual abuse in the church.

This whole shameful affair has been traumatic for Catholics and some of us feel a justified anger: anger at the perpetrators of abuse and anger at those in positions of authority who failed to act on behalf of victims/survivors.

There is no question that the church will suffer as a consequence of its actions and inactions. But that is not to say that the future is without hope. I personally believe that this is an opportunity to abandon all those unhealthy beliefs and practices that have helped to sustain and sanction a church out-of-step with the radical message of Jesus as well as being out-of-touch with the realities of our times. For too many centuries the church as an institution has constructed a power base that is at odds with the gospel. This is a betrayal of the countless faithful who by their lives have witnessed to the beauty, truth and goodness that is at the heart of our Catholic faith.

I draw your attention to the letter of our Archbishop Christopher Prowse. I also draw your attention to the Media release from the Truth Justice and Healing Council. We will hold a "liturgy of lament and hope" in our parish as our prayerful response to this calamity. It will take place this coming Thursday evening at 7.30 pm.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth; you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom. Alleluia!

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Mt 5:17-37

There is a distinct pattern to the teaching examples Jesus provides: 'You have heard it said ...'; 'but I now say to you...'. This was a common method of teaching in Jesus' day and is often used as an example to suggest that Jesus was regarded as a Rabbi in his day. It is a typical rabbinical method of interpreting scripture. The rabbi quotes the teaching (you have heard it said...) and then offers an interpretation or reinterpretation of that teaching (but I now say to you). While it is an unfamiliar teaching style for us today, it would have been common in Jesus' time.

By declaring that he has come not to abolish the Law and the Prophets, but to complete – or fulfil – them, Jesus is making it perfectly clear that his ministry and teaching is in alignment with and in accordance with the historical tradition and he is not setting out to overthrow the Jewish tradition. Rather, throughout his ministry, Jesus repeatedly calls the people to be true to the teachings of old and to live them with integrity and dedication. Resources used: Greg Sunter at LiturgyHelp
