REFLECTION

Transforming our Lives

Jesus' glorious transformation and the voice of the Father from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him!', communicates with divine authority that these two truths must be held together: Jesus is God's beloved Son and he is, as he has said, going to fulfil his messionic vocation through suffering and death. Jesus is to tread the path to Jerusalem as the Messiah who came, 'not to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many'.

The core message of this sequence of stories is about the faith of the disciples. Whilst Peter declares Jesus to be the Messiah, he and the others don't really yet know what this means. In the Transfiguration, they are given the clearest possible indication of Jesus' identity and yet they're confused and scared by what they witness. The following failure by the disciples to cast out a demon shows that they still haven't understood fully who and what Jesus is.

The araciousness of God transforms us in such a way as to effect new beginnings. Lent is a time of new beginnings which find their origin in the abundant blessings of God. The ultimate blessing of God is Jesus himself. The Lord delivers us from death and inspires us to look to the future. Through Christ Jesus we are called to a new life of holiness; we escape the fetters of death and are brought into the freedom of the resurrection. The ultimate blessing of God is Jesus himself.

Jesus tells us that to be a follower of his involves sacrifice, hardship and often unpopularity. During this Lenten season, like the disciples, we are called to consider who Jesus is and what role he plays in our lives.

PARISH NEWS

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council met on Thursday 9 March. Some of the topics of discussion were:

Youth Ministry: Council members and school leaders will meet with the youth ministers next Wednesday 15 March with a view to looking at the structure of the ministry and how the wider parish can support the youth and this ministry. Membership of the PPC: Ideally membership of the Pastoral Council would reflect who we are. It is important that the Council represents the whole parish. Membership would comprise 8 nominated parishioners plus the Pastor, Pastoral Associate and Principal of St John the Apostle Primary school [or representative] who are ex-officio members. As we currently have only 3 nominated members we are looking for 5 nominations from parishioners for the council. If you would like to nominate someone or yourself there are nomination forms in the church foyer.

Guardians & Angels [mum's & bubs]: Interest has been expressed in reviving a regular get together for parents and babies/children when they can gather for, conversation, coffee and play. The Pastoral Council endorsed this initiative.

Parish Assembly follow up: Items discussed were: Parish Pastoral Council, Pastoral Plan, Youth Ministry, and Liturgy. Discussion ensued regarding: ◆ new parishioners and how we recognise and welcome them. ◆ lay involvement – how can parishioners lighten the load on Fr. Gerard. ◆ Investigate ways that the laity can be involved in the homily.

A Shared Responsibility

For Martina, a mother of eight, escaping domestic violence was the first step in her journey to a new life. Gender based violence is a critical issue for women in Timor-Leste, and domestic violence is the most reported crime to the National Vulnerable Persons Unit. Studies show that 38 percent of women aged 15-49 experienced physical violence and 36 percent who were or had been married reported violence: - physical, sexual or emotional - by their husbands or partners.

Like many other women in Timor-Leste, Martina was driven from her home by domestic violence. Facing

GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL

In all three versions of this Transfiguration event that appear in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, the context in which the event occurs is identical. When all three of the synoptic gospels use the same story with little variation and all three retain the same context around the event then there are some pretty clear signals that this was a commonly accepted sequence of events and their sequence holds significance. In the Transfiguration, they are given the clearest possible indication of Jesus' identity and yet they're confused and scared by what they witness.
