## From the Pastor's Desk......

During the week it was announced that from 1 January 2018 the parishes Evatt and Kaleen will be amalgamated and known as Our Lady of Perpetual Help and that the parishes of Page and Aranda will likewise be amalgamated and known as the parish of St Matthew and St Vincent de Paul. Charnwood and Kippax will remain as they are for the present.

Last year the Parish Pastoral Council wrote to the Archdiocese presenting a case for Kippax to remain as a standalone parish given its MSC history and identity. However, this discussion will need to be continued between the new MSC Provincial, Fr. Chris McPhee, and Archbishop Christopher Prowse. As you know I have been reappointed parish priest for the next three years and in 2018 Fr. Kimi Vunivesilevu MSC will take up his position as assistant priest at Kippax. For the short term, at least, our continuation as an MSC (Missionaries of the Sacred Heart) parish is assured.

This may be an opportune moment to re-evaluate our MSC spirituality and to explore more deeply what it means to be an MSC parish along with our parish school. It is a spirituality that emphasizes the compassionate heart of Christ and the transformative power of God's love - surely an antidote for the many ills that afflict humanity in these turbulent times.

### **REFLECTION**

#### **Community & Peacemaking**

It is difficult for leaders to call people to accountability. Such is the unenviable responsibility of pastors in the parish, coordinators of religious education, members of the parish council, principals in the school, directors of liturgical ministry, to name but a few. Disciples must also engage in the very difficult process of reconciliation. Differences of opinion, misunderstandings, and actual offences tend to alienate people. We see this happen in families, neighbourhoods, parish communities, workplaces. It is not enough to say that we must try to forgive from our hearts. The process of reconciliation requires significant movement toward the admission of guilt as well. Both the one offended and the offender must be willing to be transformed.

Gathering two or three together in prayerful collaboration is not as easy as it sounds. If collaboration is to be effective, we have to be open and honest about our opinions and our biases, and respectful of the opinions and biases of others. We must work for the common good and not merely for what we personally think is best. We must be willing to accept and implement decisions with which we may not totally agree, and we must live with them gracefully. All of this calls for unselfish love. Love fulfils the entire law only: when we honour our personal commitments and the personal commitments of others; when we value the life, dignity and reputation of others; and when we respect their possessions. It is only because love is so demanding that it covers all of our responsibilities.

For Jesus, such teachings as forgiveness, healing, and justice are the clear evidence of a shared life. When we do not see this happening, religion is "all in the head." Peacemaking, forgiveness, and reconciliation are not some kind of ticket to heaven later. They are the price of peoplehood--the signature of heaven--now.

#### **GOSPEL IN A NUTSHELL Mt 18:15-20**

If your brother or sister listens to you, you will have won that person back.

This week's gospel provides us with a lesson that could be well heeded in our contemporary world. Matthew relates a discourse on dealing with a grievance or sin between two 'brothers' – community members; fellow disciples.

The idea of bringing a 'sinner' or offender before the church community to be confronted is one that the early Christians borrowed from the Jewish culture out of which they were formed. In Jewish society, the local synagogue was effectively a community centre. It was a gathering place, not only for worship and education, but also for meeting, debating and seeking solutions to problems. The synagogue community took on the role of mediator, witness, jury, judge and, if needed, punisher. The role of the scribes in Jewish society was to interpret the Law - the Torah – in resolving everyday situations. Resources used: Greg Sunter at LiturgyHelp
