From the Pastor's desk.....

Next Sunday and the following Sunday we will hold our parish assembly. I have already written about the importance of this assembly and I continue to urge you to be part of this gathering. We won't solve all the problems. That is not the object of the exercise. Rather, it is to help us, as a parish, move confidently into the future. Having a well-developed pastoral plan helps us to navigate that future and to implement various pastoral initiatives. That is why we want as many of you to attend this assembly – especially those who are relatively new to our parish.

It is important to keep in mind this is not a strategic plan that is familiar to the corporate world. A *pastoral* plan is ultimately open to God's desire for us. In this sense, the pastoral plan is our response to God's initiative. Our role is to discern God's will. Discernment, therefore, is the key word in the process of developing a pastoral plan.

In today's gospel we see in Jesus his way of responding to the needs of others. In the case of the man with leprosy Jesus hears his cry for help. Not only is he aware of that man's needs, but feels with compassion for his plight. It is out of this awareness and compassion that Jesus responds with his healing ministry.

It is this dynamic that we see in the ministry of Jesus that we are called to follow. Having a pastoral plan gives us a framework which can help us respond to those needs in a manner that is truly shaped by the compassionate love of Jesus.

REFLECTION

Suffering

We know that we will all have to face some kind of suffering, and so we try to prepare ourselves for it. Yet when it comes, as prepared as we try to be, it can overtake us with such fury that we fall back defenceless. We look to others for support and assistance, and if we are fortunate, we find it. However, even in the most supportive of communities, suffering tends to alienate us from those who are healthy and secure. Suffering reminds us of our own finitude and the contingent nature of all of life. It threatens our sense of order.

Jesus is not deterred by human suffering. He welcomes all who approach him; his healing touch reincorporates those who have been ostracised; his loving embrace reassociates those who have been alienated. In the reign of God, there are no outsiders. All belong to Jesus, and, therefore, all belong to each other. When the one afflicted is embraced by the community, the community is an authentic manifestation of the inclusive reign of God.

In suffering we witness human vulnerability and our desperate need of each other and of God. There, at the edge of life and on the fringes of the community, we may experience the tenderness and compassion of God. The loving touch of Christ that can heal our souls, if not our bodies. It is there that we may most authentically participate in the cross of Christ. Joined to him we are anything but unproductive or worthless.

Jesus takes on our suffering, bears it, and moves through it to resurrection. This is "the paschal mystery." We too can follow this path, actively joining God's loving solidarity with all suffering since the foundation of the world. Jesus does not ask us to worship him. He asks us to follow him by trusting and allowing this risky but revealing journey.

Heart Spirituality

Sadness has to be overcome by prayer

There are days in life when the soul is invaded by sadness.

Often we cannot explain why, but we suffer from it nevertheless.

We experience it as a moral sagging that takes away the soul's strength and energy, making it incapable of any generous resolve. Other times it is brought on by suffering, by fear of some danger, serious trouble, deception, dread of some great misfortune, a separation, the death of a parent, of a friend. Ordinarily these are the causes of our sadness.

Even the apostles were not exempt from this burden when Jesus Christ told them he was going to leave them (John 16:6). What is the remedy for this evil that presents grave dangers for us? The Holy Spirit points it out for us: it is prayer.

Is anyone among you saddened?

Let them pray (James 5:13). Indeed prayer will disperse the clouds that encircle our soul and obtain from the Heart of the Saviour the grace to get our courage back again.

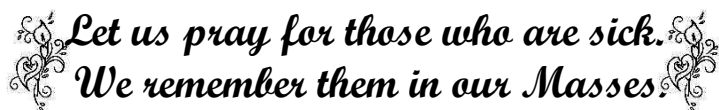
