### From the Pastor's desk......

I know many people struggle to make sense of the story of the 'sacrifice of Isaac' (or more correctly, 'the testing of Abraham'). I have to admit I struggle with this story too. But I think that's the whole point of the story, to engage us in a struggle to understand who God really is. Is God indifferent to our human suffering, or is God a God who truly cares?

The story of Abraham dragging his only son along to be sacrificed is truly a dark and troubling tale. As Abraham trudges up the mountain carrying a bundle of firewood for the sacrifice one cannot begin to imagine the terrible burden on his soul. In a sense, Abraham represents our common human story. We are all, at some point in our lives, forced to carry terrible burdens which sometimes can seem to threaten our very existence and test our faith to the core.

To understand how crucial this story is to our understanding of God we have to put ourselves in the shoes of the ancient Hebrews. In the time of Abraham human sacrifice was common and this story clearly reveals that this practice is abhorrent to the God of the Israelites. This is shown by God sending his angel to stay the hand of Abraham. In contrast to the cruel and capricious gods of the surrounding cultures, the God of Israel is a God who is on mankind's side. In spite of all the dark drama of this story, God is finally revealed as a God of blessing, not curse; a God of life, not death; a God of light, not darkness.

Ultimately, this is a story of promise. Isaac is the child of promise, a gift to Abraham and Sarah in their old age. Abraham's faith is rewarded by an even greater promise, a promise of more children than he could ever count:

I will indeed bless you, and I will make your offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. (Genesis 22.17)

We too are children of the promise, and our destiny is bound up with more blessings than we could ever imagine.

If God is for us, who is against us? (Romans 8.31) **Peace & blessings, Gerard**

## REFLECTION

#### **Transformation & Salvation**

We all have dreams for the future, dreams about success and well-being. We all want a better world for our children and grandchildren. Our religious tradition sets before us aspirations that call for personal transformation. However, sometimes when we follow the inspiration of our most devout aspirations, obstacles are thrown in our path preventing us from following our dreams. Still, God does not call us out of our dreams into a vacuum. If we are asked to relinquish a possible future, it is only to be offered God's future. Our aspirations may be noble, but the possibilities that God offers will outstrip them in excellence.

At our low points, we are one step away from either enlightenment or despair. Without *faith* that there is a Bigger Pattern, and the grace to surrender to that Bigger Pattern, most people will move into despair, negativity, or cynicism. We need a promise, a hopeful direction, or it is very hard not to give up.

Abraham was promised an heir; he relinquished his hold on his heir, and he was granted heirs beyond counting. Jesus came as a Rabbi; he allowed himself to be handed over to death, and he was revealed as the beloved Son of God.

When you have not yet learned what transformation feels or looks like, someone perhaps some loving human or simply God's own embrace—needs to hold you now because you cannot hold yourself. When we experience this radical holding, and even deep loving, this is salvation!

Do we have faith, or do we need a glimpse of Christ's transfiguration in order to believe in his resurrection? Do we have to see and touch Jesus, or are we able to believe because we have heard his message? God's future in Christ is open to us, but we must accept it in faith, even when we do not fully understand what it means.
