# From the Pastor's desk...

Back in the days of my novitiate my novice master put the following question to me and my fellow novices: "Does God live in us or do we live in God?" I had to think about this. Eventually I came to the conclusion that both perspectives are true. This seems to be born out in today's reading from John' gospel: "Abide in me as I abide in you."

It is a lovely word, "abide". It conjures up a feeling of comfort, rest and solace. I am reminded of the opening lines of the wellknown English hymn sung at Evensong: "Abide with me; fast falls the eventide". However, while we take comfort in Christ's abiding presence, there is also the demand of Christian discipleship. Christ's abides in us, but the challenge for us is to abide in him. The image of the Christ, the true vine, is a powerful one when we consider that we are grafted onto this vine.

Jesus uses an image from agriculture to express this intimate connection with God through Jesus himself: I am the vine, you are the branches. We are also reminded that we are meant to fruitful: Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit. It's another way of saying we are meant to be productive as Christians and that we can't just sit on our faith.

Christ's life becomes our life. I have found the following reflection by Fr Eugene Trainor a helpful one: "When I remain in Christ, I think, feel, and act as Christ. Christ's prayer becomes my prayer, and whatever I want is what Christ wants." To live in Christ means to bear abundant fruit.

# Reflection

#### **Remain in My Love**

At first glance, it appears that there is a certain ruthlessness about the image of the vinedresser pruning the vine: perform or perish! However, the process of cutting away and pruning branches is an incredibly nurturing action; it is removing the unproductive portions of the plant so that the vine has an even better opportunity to produce fruit in the next season. It is an act of love; not an act of economic rationalism.

We must remain in love, which is why it is a commandment (John 15:4-5), in fact, *the* great commandment of Jesus. Only when we are eager to love can we see love and goodness in the world around us.

Within our own lives we are called to make decisions about which of our thoughts and actions are life-giving (fruit-bearing) and which are unproductive; negative; crippling; life-diminishing. If we are able to 'prune' our life-diminishing thoughts and actions we allow ourselves the freedom and the ability to really flourish. Feelings of jealousy, greed, resentment, self-doubt and lack of confidence can limit our ability to be fully alive just as addictive and harmful behaviours can physically take away our ability to perform at our best.

We must ourselves remain in peace, and then we will see and find peace over there. Remain in beauty, and we will honour beauty everywhere. This concept of remaining or abiding (John 15:4-5) moves religion out of esoteric realms of doctrinal outer space where it has for too long been lost. There is no secret moral behaviour required for knowing or pleasing God, or what some call "salvation," beyond becoming a loving person in mind, heart, body, and soul. Then each of us will see all that we need to see!
