#### From the Pastor's desk......

A little girl was walking along beside her father on an evening stroll. She kept looking up at the stars. She was fascinated by them, but she wasn't talking about it. Finally her father asked her what she was thinking about and she answered, "If the bottom side of heaven is so beautiful, how wonderful the other side must be. That's where Mummy is and I know how much she loves beautiful places." The child was walking knee-deep in stardust and in that moment she helped her dad take hold of the hand of God.

This simple little story sheds insight into the greatest mystery of all: our destiny. We are heaven-bound, and our passage through this world is but a blink of the eye compared to eternity. During this month of November we particularly remember our loved ones who have gone before us.

Last week we celebrated the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls. The origins of All Saints go back to the Fourth Century. The accompanying celebration of All Souls was first celebrated in 998. Since then these celebrations have continued to grow in popularity both the church's calendar and in many places also in the civic calendar (in Italy, for example, All Saints is a public holiday). Each in their own way celebrate the Paschal Mystery – the death and resurrection of Christ in whose victory over death we share through our incorporation into Christ.

# Reflection

#### "As you love yourself"

Jesus reminds us 'You must love your neighbour as yourself.' There's an unspoken, underlying idea here that is absolutely crucial. Before you can love your neighbour, you must first love yourself. To say that you love yourself today can imply a level of boastfulness or ego.

Some people argue that Western society has already gone too far in the direction of self-love. They maintain that the lengths some people go to achieve a sculptured body, the use of steroids, the growing frequency of eating disorders, the adoration of sportsmen and women, the cult of the gym and of the cosmetic surgery industry all point to a culture too much in love with itself. Some argue what we need is a good dose of self-control. They are only half-right.

The problem with the term 'love of self' is that we often hear in it an encouragement to 'adore self'. Nothing could be further from what Jesus is saying. We are called to love our body, not worship it. Jesus is not calling us to a narcissistic love, like we see in the cosmetic surgery industry and the gym cults, where the only thing we love is our self. If we have no sense of our own self-worth, our own dignity and the personal love of God for each of us, it is impossible for us to give the same to others and to claim from others the dignity we deserve. We will either treat others as our inferiors on the one hand, or allow others to walk all over us, on the other.

Jesus shows us by the way he loved his Father, us and himself that true love always involves sacrifice. If we love our self in the right way, we have the self-control to forgo those things that are most destructive in our life and we have the generosity to do for others the things that will enrich their lives. Jesus knew that we can never love others if we hate ourselves.

What is required is a genuine love of self – an acceptance; a respect; a true valuing of self. Only then can we know how to treat others. When we ask ourselves how we would want to be treated it points us towards how we should treat others. What is summed up so simply by Jesus is a very tough ask!

#### **Love of Others**

God does not condemn the intensity of love, but the disorder of love, the corruption of love.


# Relax, Review, Reflect Faith and film MOVIT NICUTA
