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From the Pastor's desk.....

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. Not a great deal is known about the family life of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In fact it is only in Luke's gospel that we have a window into the life of Jesus growing up. The brief episode of finding of the child Jesus in the Temple nevertheless offers an important insight into relationship within the Holy Family. Fundamentally, this relationship is one of obedience. Jesus, who at the precocious age of 12, is going about fulfilling the will of his father in heaven also submits to his human mother and father. Likewise, Mary and Joseph, who exercised authority over Jesus, also stood in wonder of him and sought to obey the will of God.

There is much talk today about family values. This is good. But for Christians, the starting point for this debate is obedience to the will of God expressed in loving service. This is the model held before us in the Holy Family.

In the church's Book of Blessings, there is a lovely blessing for families that you might like to use as we welcome in the New Year.

> We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own incarnate Son to become part of a family, so that, as he lived its life, he would experience its worries and its joys. We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to your glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Message of his Holiness Pope Francis "Good politics is at the service of peace"

"Peace be to this house!"

In sending his disciples forth on mission, Jesus told them: "Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you" (Lk 10:5-6).

Bringing peace is central to the mission of Christ's disciples. That peace is offered to all those men and women who long for peace amid the tragedies and violence that mark human history. The "house" of which Jesus speaks is every family, community, country and continent, in all their diversity and history. It is first and foremost each individual person, without distinction or discrimination. But it is also our "common home": the world in which God has placed us and which we are called to care for and cultivate.

So let this be my greeting at the beginning of the New Year: "Peace be to this house!"

Reflection

Family

There is no disputing the value of the family unit. Family is at the heart of our society; at the heart of our development; and at the heart of our Church.

The human family plays a significant role in the fashioning of the broader family of God. The larger family that God initiates is specified in unique historical families, as strange and as complex as those family relationships may be, with their joys and sorrows, their barrenness and their fruitfulness. There is no way of separating this human family and the broader people of God. The plan of God does not unfold in a vacuum, but in the everyday family situations that include separation and misunderstanding as well as joy and celebration.

It is sometimes easy to glibly declare that our families are important to us, but it is in the everyday living of family life that we have the opportunity to demonstrate how serious we are. It is inevitable, as we establish our individual identity, that we will at times clash with our family's expectations and challenge the authority of parents. However, we can never forget the love, care and security our family has provided throughout our lives. Parents try to protect their children from disappointment and harm and reflect the love of God when they are repeatedly prepared to try again with damaged family relationships.

We are bound to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. It is out of love that we are called to be children of God. As children of God, we are also joined to God's own Son, who has commanded us to love one another as God has loved all. The name Jesus

The name Jesus, given to the Child, is a name of hope, for it means Saviour. It contains all the promises of the past, all the desires of the Patriarchs and of the just of the Old Law, as well all future hopes.

This is why the divine Child from his birth takes this mysterious name. In this way he opens our hearts to joy and gives us a glimpse of the salvation that he is bringing us.

By taking this name, he commits himself to become our victim when the hour of redemption sounds, in order to wash us clean in his blood from all our iniquity; in order to open heaven for us, and merit us all the graces needed to get there. I read in the name of Jesus, as in an open book, all the mysteries of love that the Heart of a God has for his creatures. How can we fail to hope! In the name of Jesus the greatest miracles have been wrought, and the regeneration of the world taken place. Merely to invoke this name with faith and love is to obtain all the help we need. Apart from Jesus, everything is weak and powerless.


