From the Pastor's desk......

In today's gospel Jesus exposes the greed of certain scribes who exploit widows – the most vulnerable in that society. Those scribes may seemingly benefit from their exalted position and the wealth that they have amassed, but this holds nor store before the scrutiny of God's kingdom. In stark contrast the poor widow – who gives all she has – is the one who will inherit the kingdom.

Jesus holds up the example of the widow's generosity as a model of true discipleship. To follow Jesus means that we give of our all. There is no such thing as partial discipleship, or Sunday Christianity. It is a total surrender of our lives to God. And this is what the generosity of the widow symbolizes: her willingness to put her life in God's hands by giving all she has.

The touching scene of the widow's 'mite' is a good antidote to the approaching pressure of the Christmas season to spend up big. For in God's eyes the tiny gift of the widow was worth far more the surplus wealth of the rich. It is the quality of our giving that matters, not the gift itself.

Reflection

Hypocrisy

Being powerful and rich is not a problem in itself. As with all gifts, it is what we do with them that show us up for who we are. The problem with religious, political, social or even family power, and the wealth that can come from it, is that it is so seductive.

Jesus condemns the scribes who parade their wealth and seek trappings of earthly power and glory: being recognised and greeted as they walk the streets; taking the front seats in the synagogue; and expecting to be seated in the place of honour at banquets. Whilst parading their wealth and feasting at banquets, they are also swallowing up the property of widows – taking advantage of those in need.

It is interesting to note that two of the three models of selfless giving in today's readings are widows, individuals who are doubly disadvantaged by the patriarchal societies of which they are members. Their generosity is religiously inspired, and it comes from women who had the least material possessions to give.

In today's Gospel the widows are being taken advantage of by the scribes, who are taking over their property for their own gain. One of the duties of the scribes was to administer the proper payment of Temple taxes. The treasury referred to in the passage is the Temple treasury. Rather than a great act of generosity, we can now see the widow's payment of Temple tax as a burdensome, heart-wrenching obligation to pay the very last coins she had to a corrupt, uncaring system. We usually read praise into Jesus' comments about the widow's offering, but it can also be read as moral outrage at the system that demands this woman pay all that she possesses to the Temple.

There is no nobility in poverty. Jesus does not praise the widow because she is poor. Jesus praises her for being generous and he indicates how the poor teach the rich about what really matters in life.

The more powerful and rich we become, the more we can think everything is our due. We can take our eye off the Giver of all gifts and avoid our responsibility to share with those who are left with nothing.

Heart Spirituality

Our duty towards the poor

We have to devote ourselves to the poor. Jesus Christ, by his example, obliges us to do this. Generally the rich are given the bread of God's Word while the poor more often than not perish for lack of this food.

The poor are also deprived of material help. Do people concern themselves about this? The poor are a chosen portion of the flock of the divine Shepherd, the privileged friend of his Heart. Could we remain insensitive to this twofold need of the poor? If our faith was more alive, we would see in them the living image of Jesus Christ and we would make more efforts to help them. Ordinarily the poor are easier to convince and convert than the rich; and they have less obstacles to overcome in order to practise virtue. A word, coming from the heart, spoken with interest in them, with love and compassionate kindness, touches them and moves them. Normally they receive such a word with docility; it practically always bears fruit.


