From the Pastor's desk......

The Solemnity of Christ the King (now called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe) marks the end of the Church's liturgical year. We have journeyed with Jesus through the scriptures and now this feast marks a fitting end to the year in which we focus of Jesus' messianic role as king. Today's gospel is from chapter 18 of John where Jesus is on trial before Pilate. Standing before Pilate is Truth itself – truth not as a set of propositions but as embodied and encountered in the very person of Jesus. Pilate fails to penetrate this mystery. Despite all his skill in the juridical and political machinations of his time, Pilate is left perplexed and bewildered in the presence of Jesus. Jesus' kingship will ultimately be revealed in his exhalation on the cross – a baffling mystery to those who judge by the standards of this world.

The Solemnity of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. This was during a time when atheism and secularism were taking hold in society. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast to remind the faithful that our hope is in Christ, who reveals the truth of who we are and of our destiny. The kingship of Jesus is not associated with wealth, power and prestige, but a kingship in which love reigns over all.

Reflection

Living the Kingdom of God, Simply

Christ's kingdom is a kingdom of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice and love and peace. We need not stand at a distance from him, afraid to approach because of our human vulnerability. He is the one who loved us so much that he handed himself over to suffering and death so that we might live. He has already brought us to birth in this kingdom through Baptism and he has taught us how to live in it.

So how do we live God's kingdom "on earth as it is in heaven" - one way is by living simply. When you agree to live simply, you put yourself outside of others' ability to buy you off, reward you falsely, or control you by money, status, salary, punishment, and loss or gain.

When you agree to live simply, you do not consider the immigrant, the refugee, the homeless person, or the foreigner as a threat to you or as competition with you. You have chosen their marginal state for yourselffreely and consciously becoming "visitors and pilgrims" in this world. A simple lifestyle is quite simply an act of solidarity with the way most people have lived since the beginnings of humanity.

When you voluntarily agree to live simply, you do not need to get into the frenzy of work for the sake of salary or the ability to buy nonessentials or raise your social standing.

When you agree to live simply, you have time for spiritual and corporal works of mercy because you have renegotiated in your mind and heart, your very understanding of time and its purposes. Time is not money, despite the common aphorism. Time is life itself!

When you agree to live simply, people cease to be possessions and objects for your consumption or use. Your lust for relationships or for others to serve you, your need for admiration, your desire to use people or things as commodities for your personal pleasure, or any need to control and manipulate others, slowly—yes, very slowly falls away. 
Working Bee
