From the Pastor's desk.....

Someone once commented that if it had been three wise women instead of three wise men then they would have asked for directions and therefore arrived on time to help with the delivery of the baby, prepared a casserole, and brought practical gifts rather than gold, frankincense and myrrh. Perhaps there is a gain of truth here. However, the wise men did get directions – two sets of directions, as it turned out. At the beginning, the star guided them. But it only took them so far. They had to seek out further directions in Jerusalem. It was here that the scriptures were able to point them in the direction of Bethlehem were the Messiah's birth was prophesized.

We all need directions in life for the simple fact that we are all on a journey. These wise men, whoever they were, were seekers. Perhaps that is a good way of describing humanity's situation. Each person, in his or her way, is seeking the truth. But we need to be guided toward that truth. In the story of magi, the star guided their journey, as did the revelation of scripture. The star might be seen as a symbol for how we might discern the hand of God traced across the universe. By observing both Nature and Revelation the magi were rewarded with beholding the Christ Child.

We too are seekers on a journey. As disciples, we are also guides, helping others find their way to the truth: a truth discovered in the miracle of the Incarnation that we celebrated on Christmas Day and the revelation of Christ to the Nations that we celebrate on this feast of the Epiphany.

Reflection

Ordinary Revelations

The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus to humankind. The wise men are the representatives of humanity bearing witness to this revelation. The Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as not only the Messiah of Israel but the Saviour of the whole world.

The manifestation of God among us changes the ways in which we perceive each other. Christ's birth provides us with the light by which we see a new criterion for relating. The Magi represent the multi-ethnic and cultural diversity in civic and parish situations, as well as the many religions of the world. All people, regardless of race or ethnic origin, can be coheirs with Christ.

The Magi are changed by their encounter with the child Jesus and they go home a different way; in a different state; in a whole different frame of mind. When we genuinely encounter Jesus – in scripture, in life, in prayer, in ourselves – then we cannot go home the same way; we must go home by a different way as the Magi did.

Life itself is the primary divine revelation. God is manifest in the ordinary, in the actual, in the daily, in the now, in the concrete incarnations of life. God's revelations are through the concrete and specific. God reveals God's self to us through what unfolds as our life, along with every visible thing around us. These ordinary revelations must be respected and listened to deeply. Our experiences of ordinary life will transform us if we are willing to experience them fully.

Once you can see that God is in the ordinary and that you don't have to climb upward or be pure or perfect to find God, you start honouring God in what Jesus calls "the least of the brothers and sisters" (Mathew 25:40) and in the very common earth beneath our feet.

Our action in the world matters, because it contributes both to the deeper incarnation of God and to the redemptive gathering of the whole world, and not just human souls, into the body of Christ.

Let us thank the divine Heart, if we are called to lead the hidden life; and let us see if we can profit from it for our spiritual growth.
