From the Pastor's desk.....

In today's gospel we hear about a feast. In the parable there are two sons who both, in their own way, hurt their father: the first, by his self-centred behaviour, the other, by refusing to celebrate his brother's return. But in spite of this the father shows nothing but love and solicitude. He invites them both to a feast. It is a feast of reconciliation. The Eucharistic, among other things, is also a feast of reconciliation. For in the Mass we are called to be reconciled to one another and to God in this banquet that expresses our unity.

After the Eucharistic Prayer the assembly stands to pray the Lord's Prayer which is followed by the Sign of Peace. These two actions help prepare us for Communion by reminding us of the intrinsic connection between Eucharist and Reconciliation. In the Lord's Prayer the fourth petition, "give us this day our daily bread" relates to the Eucharist in which we are about to partake. The fifth petition, "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us", is a reminder that of our need to be reconciled with God and one another in order that our communion be holy.

We pray to "Our Father", not "My Father..." conscious that we belong both to God and God's family. The Sign of Peace naturally follows the Lord's Prayer, reinforcing our oneness in Christ. Thus we are prepared to receive communion in its widest, deepest and truest meaning: communion with Christ and one another.

The gospel story has both a happy and a sad ending. While the younger son is reconciled to his father, the older son remains embittered and estranged. This parable is a challenge for us as followers of Jesus to be ambassadors of God's reconciliation through our own practice of reaching out in healing love. May our celebration of the Eucharistic be for us a source of peace and reconciliation.





Reflection

God's Love

The Gospel accepts that life is tragic, but it graciously adds that we can survive and will even grow from this tragedy. Growth happens: in honest community and committed relationships. Love is learned in the encounter with "otherness" as the Jewish philosophers Martin Buber and Emmanuel Levinas taught. It all depends on whether we are willing to see down as up and learn to draw upon the Infinite Source.

When we human beings "admit" to one another "the exact nature of our wrongs," we invariably have a human and humanizing encounter that deeply enriches both sides and even changes lives! It is no longer an exercise to achieve moral purity or regain God's love, but in fact, a direct encounter *with* God's love. It is not about punishing one side, but liberating both sides.

Love, like forgiveness, is a decision. It's a decision in your mind and in your heart. And you'd better make it early in the day, because once you're a few hours into resentment, it's too late.

Forgiveness becomes central to Jesus' teaching, because to receive reality is always to "bear it," to bear with reality for not meeting all of our needs. To accept reality is to forgive reality for being what it is, almost day by day and sometimes even hour by hour. Such a practice creates patient and humble people.

Forgiveness reveals *three goodnesses* simultaneously. When we forgive, we choose the goodness of the other over their faults, we experience God's goodness flowing through ourselves, and we also experience our own capacity for goodness in a way that almost surprises us. We are finally in touch with a much Higher Power, and we slowly learn how to draw upon this Infinite Source.

The return of the prodigal son

He has made up is mind: *I shall arise and go....* He does not put off his departure until tomorrow. He sets out right away at a fast pace. He thinks only of one thing: to appeal to his mercy and to ask his pardon. His heart is broken in repentance, making him shed tears of sorrow.

This is how I should feel! I have offended God who is my Father. In a moment of foolishness I have distanced myself from him; I have saddened his heart by straying. He is worried about what is happening to me; I feel that he is calling me; he is yearning for my return; he is waiting for me day and night; he makes the first move by his grace. I cannot resist any longer.

So it is decided: I shall arise and go!...

Stewardship

God created all things, and God never transferred the ownership of his creation to humankind. So if God owns everything, what are we supposed to do? Our role is to be a steward. And a steward is a manager of someone else's possessions.

Acknowledging God's ownership requires a transformation of thinking and this is never an easy thing to do. It's easy to give intellectual assent to the idea that "God owns all that I have," but still live as if this wasn't true at all. When we acknowledge God's ownership, every spending decision becomes a spiritual decision.

We owe God everything! But let's start by giving him one little thing. Take even a faltering step closer to Him — go to confession, join in the Stations of the Cross, call a family member or friend you are at odds with and try to reconcile. That is what lent is all about.
