From the Pastor's desk.....

Today is known as Good Shepherd Sunday, it is also World Day of Prayer for Vocations – obviously there is a link between the two. Jesus says, "My sheep listen to my voice and follow me." We are all called to follow Jesus in a committed way of life, and this can be lived as single, married, ordained or as consecrated religious sister or brother. However, what remains constant is that we listen to where Jesus is callina us.

Vocations Sunday has a particular focus on vocations to the priesthood and religious life. We constantly hear that there is a shortage of priests, sisters and brothers, but that does not mean that God has stopped calling men and women to priesthood and consecrated religious life. Women and men are still responding to the call to priesthood and religious life. One must admire their courage and commitment in an era that is in many ways indifferent, suspicious and in some cases hostile toward religion. So I certainly admire young men and women who do step forward to witness in a radical way to Jesus Christ and his message of love.

We need to continue to pray and support vocations to reliaious life and priesthood. But at a deeper level, I believe, God is calling all members of the church. First, the church is called to renewal. Certainly the scandal of sexual abuse has highlighted that in a most dramatic and, indeed, traumatic way. Attitudes and structures within the church, especially among the hierarchy, need to change. Secondly, this is the era of the laity. It is time that laity are empowered to use their gifts for the building up of Christ's body, the Church.

Christ the Good Shepherd, is calling all of us to listening deeply to his voice. When we do, we will surely know his will for us and his church.

Reflection

What we need is Community

The point of the shepherd analogy in the Gospels, of course, is about the importance of intimacy. A sheep in first century Palestine is similar to the central role some domestic cats and dogs have in our homes. They are members of the family. Shepherds in Jesus' day belonged to nomadic tribes that moved with their small flock throughout Israel. Every sheep mattered. Every sheep had a name. In an agrarian society every sheep was a vital economic unit. To lose one caused trouble not only to the individual, but also to the tribe. To lose a flock was financial ruin for a generation. As a result, when Jesus invokes the image of the shepherd he draws attention to the intimate knowledge and care the shepherd has of them.

We know many people who, for a variety of reasons, have left the fold and been seduced into pursuing other leads. Whereas every Sunday we affirm that we cannot find a better way to live than following the Way, the Truth and the Life which is Christ present here and now. No one can suggest it is always easy to follow the Gospel and hang in here with one another.

The problem of faith in our time is the problem of unbelief among believers. For too many of us, faith in Christ is little more than a hangover... toxic residue from a former activity. What is the issue behind this? The problem, is a problem of credibility, the faith is no longer believable to, nor livable for, many in our age.

What, singularly, are we missing today within Christianity that could make us credible to the world and to our own families? Community. The greatest need of our time is for koinonia, the call simply to be church....to offer to the world a living, breathing, loving community of church.

Jesus was never under any illusions about what following his lead may cost, but he underlines how much we need each other to survive in this world.

Do you hear the cry that comes to us across eighteen centuries? It is his testament of love:

I want all to be one in love; just as we ourselves are one [John 17:11,21]. From where comes this cry? From the Heart of Jesus. He calls for unity. To break unity is to wound him cruelly. But this unity can only exist in truth. Unity becomes impossible if based on concessions to error or compromise; our Master made none. Though full of tact in dealing with sinners who had gone astray through weakness, he severely rebuked the proud Pharisees who resisted the truth and concealed their disorderly loves behind a deceitful piety [Mt. 12:24-34].

Stewardship

Living as God's stewards does not mean a life of ease or a life free of sacrifice. Sometimes the steward's life involves great challenges, requiring all the strength and love one has to give. But in the end there is simply no more satisfying way to live.

The Gospel reading today tells us that we must live in trust and dependence on Jesus, our Shepherd. When we cling tightly to Him by freeing ourselves from holding on too tightly to our "stuff," our time, and our achievements, we can hear His voice. He says so Himself: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." He knows us! He laid down His life for us to give us eternal life with Him. He will never ask anything of us that will harm us. A stewardship way of life is meant only to enrich us.
