Reflection

The Human Journey

Jesus both reveals and identifies with humanity in all its stages, and even reveals the trajectory of all history—at its beginning, at its lowest points, and at its fulfilled end.

At the beginning, for both Jesus and us, the soul is already one with God. Just as Jesus is the Son of God, we also are daughters or sons of God from conception. Jesus' unique and inclusive "sonship" declares us as "co-heirs" and "adopted children" in Paul's theology (Romans 8:14-17). Yet this divine conception is hidden from all of us until we discover it.

Jesus encounters trials and hostility, leading to abandonment and betrayal, just as most human lives do in some form or another. He thus identifies with humanity at its lowest points.

At our low points, we are one step away from either enlightenment or despair. Without faith most people will move into despair, negativity, or cynicism. When you have not yet learned what transformation feels or looks like, someone—perhaps some loving human or simply God's own embrace—needs to hold you now because you cannot hold yourself. When we experience this radical holding, and even deep loving, this is salvation!

Jesus reveals and identifies with the final chapter of the human journey at its promised and now fulfilled form. He becomes the goal personified—the Risen Christ! This is where we are all heading: to resurrection. What humanity fears, hates, destroys, pollutes, kills, and crucifies, *God promises to transform and raise up!*

Quietly and unrecognized, the circle comes "full circle" in what we call the Ascension of Jesus (Acts 1:9-11). We all return where we first started, with the great school of life and death ushering us back home.

It is indeed possible to refuse this whole journey of love. Otherwise God is a Puppeteer and we are mere puppets. Love can only exist in the realm of ever more perfect freedom.

Jesus told his disciples:

It is for your own good that I am going to my Father, because I go to prepare a place for you, and to send you the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of truth who will teach you everything (John 16:7). The role of Jesus in heaven is the role of a mediator who never ceases to plead on our behalf and to cry aloud for God's mercy upon us: Mediator between God and humanity (1 Tim 2:5). "Jesus entered heaven itself, so that he could appear in the presence of God on our behalf" (Heb. 9:24).

Knowing our weakness and the dangers we incur here below, he asks without ceasing for the graces we need: living forever to intercede for us (Heb. 7:25). Why? Because it is his wish that we may one day possess the throne he has prepared for us. Since his Heart is full of love for us, let us ask him to bless and protect us.


