From the Pastor's desk......

The Victorian Court of Appeal decision that was handed down on Wednesday that upheld Cardinal George Pell's conviction is but another sorry episode in the travesty that has continued to plague the church. Wherever the truth lies in the case of George Pell the glaring fact is that the church has failed in a most spectacular manner. Nothing short of a courageous and soul-searching effort to reform the church is called for.

Yet despite its failings the church must continue to proclaim the gospel message of Jesus. In its prophetic role the church is called to interpret contemporary issues through the lens of Jesus' teaching. This Sunday we mark the occasion of the 105th World Day for Migrants and Refugees. Below is a short quote from Pope Francis' 2019 message for World Day for Migrants and Refugees Sunday:

The most economically advanced societies are witnessing a growing trend towards extreme individualism which, combined with a utilitarian mentality and reinforced by the media, is producing a "globalization of indifference". In this scenario, migrants, refugees, displaced persons and victims of trafficking have become emblems of exclusion. In addition to the hardships that their condition entails, they are often looked down upon and considered the source of all society's ills. That attitude is an alarm bell warning of the moral decline we will face if we continue to give ground to the throw-away culture. In fact, if it continues, anyone who does not fall within the accepted norms of physical, mental and social well-being is at risk of marginalization and exclusion. Reflection

What is your Status?

Today's gospel makes clear that to gain salvation, you have to do more than just show up! Like those knocking on the locked door and claiming friendship, we can't just turn up at the last minute and expect to be received. Salvation — entrance into the kingdom of God — belongs to those who accept the message of Jesus and act on it for the rest of their lives.

Jesus reminds his audience that their status in society means nothing when it comes to their status in the kingdom of God. What will make people 'first' in the kingdom is their acceptance of Jesus' message, their faith and their compassionate actions toward others. Jesus' insistence on the inherent value of the 'last' in society must have been a constant irritant to those who considered themselves 'first'.

Jesus tells his audience that people who are faithful to his message, even though they may be Gentile, will gain salvation before anyone who thinks they deserve it because of their birth or title. The kingdom is attained through faithful effort, not by just turning up and claiming to be a believer.

To be Christian is more than a name; more than a title. If we put our hand up and claim the title of Christian, then there are consequences that flow from that. Those who are disillusioned by religion frequently name hypocrisy as the major reason for their disillusionment. Sometimes, that's an easy out. We can't all live like Jesus all of the time. However, we are called to take Jesus as our model of the Christian life and to use his example as a guiding beacon. To call ourselves Christian is to try to be Christ-like in all our actions.

It is good to think of the network of love with which God at every moment surrounds each soul he created on earth. With each one he acts in a different way. Although their differences are numberless, the attentions of his love are more. Each one's biography is a marvelous history of God's goodness. Could Gold's limitless, all powerful love allow him in the end to lose most of those he wanted to save? In the implacable duel between love and hatred, life and death, is the final and eternal victory to be won by death and hatred? God did not die on a cross to reap a lean harvest of elect, here and there! His harvest will be rich and superabundant! And the final victory will be his. The Heart of Jesus, to whom we owe heaven, fills us with the most consoling hope, for he is mercy incarnate.


Stewardship

St. Paul often in his letters, remind us over and over that our thoughts should be as much on the next life as on this one. Yet when we hear in today's Gospel that the first will be last and the last will be first, we may think there is some lack of justice there.

Jesus does not state this as a definite. He actually is telling us that the first may be last and the last may be first. The truth is that it really is not important. Our faith, the Lord, our sense of stewardship repeatedly remind us that what we think is important on earth may not be important in heaven at all. There is a Greek proverb that says, "Being first is good, but being last is perfect." We are all called to discipleship and we need to answer that call. Responding before someone else does not make us better, but responding is very important.
