From the Pastor's desk......

Today's gospel makes no bones about the consequences of inaction. To ignore the poor at our door in the eyes of God is indeed a very grave omission. The parable of rich man who ignores the needs of his destitute neighbour at his doorstep is suddenly reversed. The poor man, Lazarus, is now being comforted in heaven while a great gulf separates the rich man from sharing in the feast of heaven.

The message is stark and plain. As individuals and as a society we have a moral obligation to care for all who are disadvantaged which includes both those within our society and those beyond our borders. There is simply not a choice between the two. Economic growth is important to any nation. But it must benefit all the citizens. Unfortunately, we witness an increasing gap between the rich and poor. It is the parable of Lazarus told anew in our own times. Whether it be cutting back on foreign aid or social welfare, it amounts to the same thing: an indifference to the plight of the poor.

It was with much sadness that we heard of the death of Fr John Rate MSC who died in Adelaide last Sunday night. John had been struggling with cancer for the past three years while he had been parish priest of Henley Beach in Adelaide. Many of our parishioners would have cherished memories of John's time here as parish priest. John brought with him many gifts including his love of the liturgy, which was evident in the major church renovations that he undertook during his time here.

We welcome Dean Fonseca to our parish. Dean will be here for one month as part of his pastoral experience before entering the MSC novitiate at Douglas Park. I will be away on annual leave over the next two weeks.

Reflection

Challenging our Comfort Zone

Today's parable shows us we have a pattern in our culture that teaches us to insulate ourselves from suffering, to build up gates and walls and border fences that separate us from those who are suffering right outside of our comfort.

The poor man, Lazarus, is described as sitting at the gate of the rich man. We have a picture of Lazarus sitting on the outside looking in at all that he cannot have. Gates are used both literally and metaphorically throughout the gospel of Luke. In the cities and towns of Palestine, gates marked a physical barrier between those who were 'in' and those who were 'out'. But they also marked the boundaries of society. Those who were permitted to sleep within the walls were the acceptable of society. Those who were shut outside the gates and outside the city of an evening were the unacceptable.

In building up gates and barriers we come to find out that not only are we locking the suffering out, but we're locking ourselves into a life that's incredibly lonely. Those patterns rob us of life and community.

St. John Chrysostom pointed out that Lazarus is the only person named in the parables of Jesus. His name means "the one that God heard and rescued." The rich man is not given a name. He cries out to Father Abraham, so it sounds like he was a religious man, but he had locked the poor out of his life. I think the invitation is to rewrite the end of the story. We have an invitation to tear down the walls, to bust through the fences, and to get to know the names and the faces of those who are suffering outside of our comfort.

Time and again, God makes plain to the people, through the prophets, that what they are expected to do is live in right relationship with one another and with God. The rich man's focus of attention was on himself and not others. He lacked the compassion and mellowness of heart that Jesus reminded people was expected by God.

Stewardship

The rich man did nothing wrong to Lazarus, he suffered the sin of omission by not caring for him in any way.

The same dilemma confronts each of us as we live our lives. Sometimes we feel as if we are doing right by doing no wrong. Stewardship, on the other hand, calls us to a deeper insight of life. Stewardship is a life of action, not a passive approach to living. Good stewards are always looking for the ways they can help others, the behaviour that permits them to be Jesus to and for other people. The rich man pleads with the Lord to allow him to go back and tell his brothers the pitfalls of ignoring those around them, but it is too late.

It is never too late for us, nevertheless. It is never too late to get involved in a ministry at our parish which reaches out to those in need. It is never too late to take action through our communities and the many charities around us to have an impact on those who are poor, both in a real sense and in a spiritual sense.


