## 27 October 2019 From the Pastor's desk.....

**30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME** 

In the parable of today's gospel two men go into the temple to pray, a Pharisee and a tax collector. One despised by society, the other held in esteem. Only one walks out of the temple at right with God: the one who truly confronts his sinfulness. The Pharisee boasts about his self-righteousness – as if God is going to be impressed! All too often we witness the bragging of political leaders and celebrity figures. We need more humility in our civil discourse. Less grandstanding. Less taking the high moral ground. The parable is clear: it is not the esteemed and powerful of this world, but the person of humble heart that walks closely with God.

This weekend the parish school of St John the Apostle celebrates its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It is a moment to take time to express our gratitude to the many dedicated staff, past and present, who have worked so hard over the years to make St John's the special place that it is. It is much more than a place of leaning – it is a place of the heart. Each time I visit the school I sense the MSC spirit alive and well. ## Reflection

### **Honesty in Prayer**

Last week's Gospel passage emphasised the need for persistence in prayer, this week's passage is about the way in which we come before God in prayer. It is the tax collector, whose simple prayer is 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner,' who goes home at rights with God. In this simple prayer, the tax collector recognises that he is not in right relationship with God and asks for God's mercy.

The model of faith that is depicted over and over again in this gospel is the one who recognises their need for God's loving mercy and asks for it. We are repeatedly reminded that God's mercy, forgiveness and abundant love are constantly out-flowing towards us and all we have to do is humbly desire and welcome them.

Humility is at the heart of this parable. The Pharisee is representative of those who are assured of their own rightness but who rely on comparison with others to make themselves feel righteous and justified. The actions of this man were not limited to Pharisees alone, nor are they limited to a particular time and place. This man's attitude of asserting his own faithfulness and religious observance by comparison with others can be easily seen in the world today. All faiths seem to be afflicted with these characters who assure themselves of their own 'goodness' by railing against those who are different. But, as the parable assures us, it is the humble who are exalted by God.

For the Pharisee, his prayer is a competition. He prays aloud so that others can hear him and be impressed. His prayer is also an opportunity to make himself look good at the expense of another.

Prayer is a time to celebrate with God our triumphs and successes, but above all it is an opportunity to be truly honest with God and with ourselves. The prayer of the tax collector is the most honest of prayers. This honesty is what is impressive; not the competitive showing off.

### **Humility**

Jesus says, I put humility first among all the virtues, because it is the root of all the others, and because it was especially humility that I taught the world. If you possess it, you will avoid spectacular actions; you will remain in the shade, unless obedience calls you forward. Those who always want to attract attention, or who appear only when they are sure of success, are far from possessing this virtue. They seek fame and applause more than anything else.

### **Stewardship** Humility in Prayer

The Pharisee was full of self as he approached God. He felt no real need for God as he rattled off his resume of good works and spiritual practices. He was simply going through the motions of prayer. His lack of humility prevented him from entering into a real dialogue with the Father. He was not transformed by his time of prayer because he was so full of himself that He left God no space to enter in.

The tax collector, by contrast, emptied himself as he approached God. He recognized who he truly was (a sinner) and asked simply for mercy, leaving all the rest up to God. This is the kind of attitude that God can work with! This is how a good steward prays — with trust, with complete openness to God's will, with a listening mind and heart, ready to serve as God leads.

The good steward knows he needs God, and that God has chosen to need him in advancing the Kingdom. His prayers pierce the clouds and God is glorified.
