# From the Pastor's desk......

For many centuries the Jewish people resisted the temptation to establish a monarchy. They witnessed the semi-divine status attributed to monarchs of neighbouring nations and viewed this with distain. Only God was sovereign. Finally, when the monarchy was established in Judea it was a lowly shepherd boy who was chosen. This image of the shepherd-king was unique in the ancient world. This ideal of the king caring for his people as a shepherd cares for his flock did not endure as the future kings of the southern and northern kingdoms of Israel gradually succumbed to the corruptive temptation of power.

Jesus was born of the lineage of David. But he did not claim any earthly power. Indeed, his throne was destined to be the cross. His cross bore the inscription: INRI, the initials of the Latin IESVS·NAZARENVS·REX·IVDÆORVM (Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews). It is of the extreme irony that on the cross all vestige of human dignity is stripped away and yet it is from this place of absolute desolation that the power of God's love is manifested.

Pope Francis has certainly been setting an example of shepherd leadership demonstrated by Jesus. He clearly shuns the medieval trappings of papal ceremony. As we pray and wait on the deliberations of the Plenary Council in 2020 may the Church in Australia learn to walk humbly in the way of the Crucified and Risen Saviour.

# Reflection

### **Christ the King**

In today's gospel, the message and ministry of Jesus are directed specifically to those who are afflicted, outcast and poor. The significance of the role played by the poor is highlighted by the framing of the whole narrative in this gospel: the birth of Jesus is celebrated by shepherds and his death is accompanied by criminals.

In response to the criminal's faith, Jesus assures him, 'today you will be with me in paradise'. There is a certainty and immediacy about the response. Jesus does not tell him that sometime in the future he will be rewarded for his faith. No, it is *today* that the criminal will join Jesus in paradise. It is an expression of the welcome and inclusion that Jesus has extended to the outsider and the undervalued throughout his ministry. It is a clear indication that the Kingdom of God that Jesus has worked to bring about is a kingdom of inclusion and welcome.

We know that Christ our King is not about earthly power, land, buildings, riches or might. We know Jesus' Kingship is not about lording it over us, or making us frightened of his compassionate judgement.

However, we do not properly grasp the meaning of Jesus' kingship, unless we are prepared to adopt the dying thief's position and point of view – his vision of Jesus, his simple faith, and his sincere plea. He is our 'point of insertion' into the mystery of the One who joins us on our journey to lead us on his journey to the Father.

The entire liturgical year is brought to completion in the last words of the gospel: 'Today you will be with me in Paradise.' These are the words that we all long to hear, words that are empty when coming from one who has no authority, but charged with power when spoken by the one who is king over us all.

The power of Christ the King is seen in his memory, holding every person in this world close; calling each one of us by name.
