Reflection

No one can go to Heaven alone

Jesus tells us that it's easy to love those who love us anyone can do that. The test of Christian love is to love those who seem unlovable or even seek to make themselves appear unlovable. It's easy to stop saying hello to the person who never returns your greeting. It's easy to avoid the person whose disability makes you uncomfortable. It's easy to hate the person who's nasty to you. But Jesus says that it's these people who we must love. If we are only polite, pleasant and hospitable to our friends then we are failing to follow the footsteps of Jesus.

The goal of the spiritual journey is to discover and move toward connectedness and relationship on ever new levels, while also honouring diversity. We may begin by making connections with family and friends, with nature and animals, and then grow into deeper connectedness with those outside our immediate circle, especially people of races, religions, economic classes, gender, and sexual orientation that are different from our own. Finally, we can and will experience this full connectedness as union with God. For some it starts the other way around: they experience union with God—and then find it easy to unite with everything else.

What we do unto others or to the earth, we really do to ourselves. Without connectedness and communion, we don't exist fully as our truest selves. Becoming who we really are is a matter of learning how to become more and more deeply connected. No one can possibly go to heaven alone—or it would not be heaven.

If we want a sustainable community, we must *always* welcome the "other" and learn to see our neighbour as ourselves.

We should not maintain any resentment against our enemies. We have to forgive them [Lk. 6:37]. Who more than God would be in his rights to keep up his resentment against us because of our daily infidelity? Yet he shows himself full of kindness. Do we conduct ourselves in the same way towards those against whom we have complaints? Often we shun their presence or, speaking to them, only make them feel our coldness. Jesus commands us to love our enemies [Mt. 5:44]. Despite its cost, this is essential if we want to be disciples and friends of the Sacred Heart. People are content to say: I do not wish trouble upon my enemies, but everything in me resists my seeing them and speaking with them; they have offended me too greatly. If those are our sentiments, we are not Christians.
