# Reflection

## **Encountering Jesus Face to Face**

All people thirst for meaning, but of what does that meaning consist? The people in the desert thirsted for water, but they misunderstood their thirst. The woman of Samaria thirsted. Her conversation with Jesus showed that she thirsted for understanding and insight as well as water.

The woman's encounter with Jesus is a moment of transformation for her. At first, she fails to comprehend his reference to 'living water' and never being thirsty again. However, in the end 'the woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town.' Leaving her water jar behind was a sign of the transformation that had taken place within her.

The Samaritan woman's personal encounter with Jesus compels her to start spreading the good news about the amazing man she has met. She meets Jesus face to face and feels compelled to act on what she has felt. Lent is a time for each of us to again – or for the first time – seek out a face to face encounter with Jesus. Through prayer, contemplation on scripture or reflection on encountering Jesus in the face of others, we build a one to one relationship with Jesus. When we acknowledge this relationship, like the Samaritan woman, we are compelled to act on it.

Jesus identifies himself as the source of water that guarantees eternal life. He places before the Samaritan woman a choice that requires a step of profound faith. She knows the thirst-quenching quality of the water from Jacob's well, but she is not acquainted with the water promised by this stranger who is also an enemy of her people. The choice is not an obvious one. A similar choice is placed before us. We know the demands of our culture and the circumstances of our lives. Are we able to acknowledge the sins of which we are guilty, recognise the grace that is being offered to us, and make the right choice? Resources used: *Reflection*, by Greg Sunter, & Reflection, by

## Return to your Heart

Jesus Christ urges us to change our life. Return into yourself, he tells us through his Prophet: Sinners, return to your heart [Is. 46:8]; that is, change your ideas, for most of them are false and contrary to the Gospel. Often you call good what in reality is evil, and evil what in reality is good: Woe to those who call evil good and good evil [Is. 5:20]. If we want to profit from this teaching, we should esteem from now on what we have despised; we should make ourselves a new heart by changing our sentiments: Make yourself a new heart [Ez. 18:31]. How often our ideas turn towards material objects and fasten on to them as though the world was not due to pass away; and far too often,

unfortunately, we remain insensitive to the good things of eternity.

#### **Stewardship**

Our Gospel passage from John recounts the life-changing encounter Christ has with the Samaritan woman at the well beginning with His words to her, "Give me a drink." Then, He adds, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

Christ is speaking the very same words to us to us today. These two verses encapsulate the call to stewardship. Christ asks us to "give him a drink" by sharing what we have with Him and with others for His sake. Yet, it is Christ Himself who provides the water — the living water that is His grace.

God has chosen to include us in His plan for bringing all people to salvation through Him. We live out our part in His plan through a stewardship way of life. This Lent, let us resolve to respond to His call with passion and commitment.

# Child Safeguarding Training


(The Gift of our Children) is being held as follows:
