From Fr. Gerard.....

I enjoyed my visit to Kippax last weekend, albeit under extraordinary circumstances surrounding the pandemic. Because of the restricted numbers at Mass I was not able to catch up with most parishioners, but you are all in my prayers in these difficult times.

Since my visit, church services have been curtailed and even churches locked - harsh but necessary measures in order to combat this extremely virulent disease.

The necessary precautions that the government has placed on church services will affect parishes financially. We all know that there is a financial cost as well as a health cost to this emergency. It is inevitable that many parishioners will feel the financial strain in various degrees, some more severely than others. The parish is not immune. Like households the parish has ongoing bills such as utilities etc. With a reduced income it goes without saying that the parish itself will struggle.

The Australian Government has announced a \$17.6 billion economic plan to stimulate the economy. The focus is on keeping Australians in jobs and helping small and medium sized businesses to stay in business. The number of unemployed is growing as businesses close their doors. With our church doors closed and no Sunday offering we do not want to see our staff unemployed.

As a religious non-profit organisation the parish does not qualify for any monetary stimulus from the Government. To remain economically viable and meet all of our economic responsibilities we need your support. For this reason, I am asking parishioners to continue as best you can with your financial contribution to the parish

While the days ahead will be challenging for individuals, our nation, and our global community, we will eventually come through this crisis when we will be able to resume our normal parish life.

Reflection

The Tombs we are locked in

On this last Sunday in Lent Lazarus is given to us to help us think about the tombs in which we lie hidden and the life to which we are called. The bad spirit seduces most of us into having some form of secretive life. It might be a secret we can't tell, a sin we can't confess or a memory we want to bury. At its worst it can be a lifestyle or a pattern of unethical behaviour we have divorced from the rest of our lives. We may even con ourselves into believing that all of this is normal and 'not so bad'.

These tombs often look similar. They seem small on the surface, but as we get away with our secrets we bury ourselves in them more deeply. We jealously guard the entrance, displacing energy to defend our tombs and we're ashamed if anyone rolls away the stone and sees the mess inside.

But this Sunday Jesus stands at the entrance of our tombs and calls us out of them. We're asked to face down the bad spirits that keep us locked in secrecy, to move away from shame, embrace repentance, recognise the price to be paid for being true to what's best in ourselves and we're invited to know the light and life of Christ's healing and forgiveness.

No one can pretend that this journey is easy, but it's what Lent is all about: the journey from the tomb of our own particular deaths, through penance to the new life of Easter. May this Eucharist allow us to see the Lord stand at our tomb and gently call us by name, 'Come forth'. And at His word may we be unbound and let go free.

Stewardship

How can we please God by putting Him first? Our second reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Romans, gives us good instruction. "Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh... you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you." To be "in the flesh" means that we allow our own selves — our whims, our pleasure, our comfort-seeking — to determine our daily decisions. To be "in the flesh" is to spend our time, talent and material gifts primarily on ourselves. When we are in the flesh, we leave no room for the Spirit of God to fill our thoughts, our hearts and our souls.

The disciplines of Lent and the disciplines of a stewardship way of life are wonderful gifts that free us from too great an attachment to "the flesh." The sacrifices we make in a particular way during this holy season, and every day when we truly embrace a stewardship way of life, are not meant to restrict our freedom and joy. Quite the contrary — they are tools to help us find the real freedom and joy that only come when we make room in our lives for God. In fact, the more we allow God to take over every aspect of our lives, the freer and more joyful we become.


