From the Assistant Pastor.....

A New Relationship

In the gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he's moving on. They don't feel ready yet, and they're afraid. The disciples, it seems, have come to possess Jesus. They feel close to him. He always seems to be in charge and make the best decisions. His teachings are inspiring and helpful. If he goes away, won't all that be lost?

Jesus understands all those fears. He knows our insecurity. He cares about us even more than we care about ourselves. The gospel today shows how much he cares. It begins four chapters of assurances in the form of a farewell talk after dinner. His opening words are, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." And he goes on from there, telling us why we should not be troubled. He recognizes our feelings, and he addresses those feelings.

He knows how important it is to move on. So, he is preparing the disciples. He understands that they cannot realize how important it is to move on until it actually happens.

If Jesus had stayed, the whole Church would have to be around him. It would be limited and localized. It could hardly grow and embrace the whole world. If Jesus goes to the Father, then the Church can grow. True, there would be growing pains like in the first reading. But notice that they solved the problems and moved on. The Church's destiny is to grow. And for that to happen, Jesus has to move on.

Remember the closing lines of the Gospel." I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father." And notice that he promises greater works, as well. How right Jesus was when he said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." Jesus is the way and the truth and the life. Let us follow him confidently.

Reflection

Domestic Churches

Jesus is the cornerstone upon which the Christian community is built, and the community mirrors his influence in its life.

When we reflect on our childhood homes many of us can say of it what Jesus says of himself. It was the first place almost all of us learnt about 'The Way'. The earliest Christians were called people of The Way. It's a rich image denoting that Christianity is not an idea, it's a way of living, a path to follow.

For better or worse one of the distinctive features of most of our homes is that it's also where we are told 'The Truth'. Sometimes that deflates our egos or means we hear things we would rather not listen to. But hopefully the comfort and love which accompanies this truth telling comes from the ease and care in the relationships at home. Our family doesn't pull any punches with the truth because they know us too well and love us too much.

Most adults also remember their childhood houses as lively. 'The Life' in our homes was about the buzz of children going to and from school, various friends calling in, the reign of organised chaos where space was claimed and a position defended. Minor dramas were never far away and life was lived to the full.

It's not by accident that the image of Jesus preparing us a house and being the Way, the Truth and the Life are put together in today's Gospel. In another part of John's gospel Jesus goes further in describing himself as our master builder, as our home and even our lodger. We are told to make a home in him as he makes a home in us. What a terrific image of the intimacy Christ wants to share with us, and we with him!

The Way we follow is about justice, development and peace for all people everywhere and not just the select few who can build the biggest mansions on earth. We are invited to keep speaking the Truth even if that makes us unpopular or different or at odds with the majority.

If all Christians lived out this Way, Truth and Life we would, by His grace, fulfil Jesus' extraordinary prophecy that we could do greater works than He did.

The life of Jesus is marked by three solemn periods: his entry into the world, his public mission and his death on the cross. His Mother is associated with these great events that bring about a whole new life. She is there as the sacrament of divine love, as the mysterious helpmate of the new Adam, in a new creation. She gives birth on Calvary to all peoples in God, made fruitful by the blood and grace flowing from his Sacred heart. At Cana she obtains from her son the first of his miracles; she establishes the Apostles in faith and receives the assurance of the institution of the eucharist and other sacraments. She is going to carry to Hebron the Saviour, still hidden in her womb, causing the grace of salvation to come down on the son of Elizabeth.
