Ascension of our Lord

What we celebrate on Sunday is our destiny. We feel that the completion of Jesus' story is the goal of our lives, the complete and final fulfilment of our heart, which we call "Heaven." Our hearts were not made for this earth; nothing here on earth will ever satisfy us fully. We will never be completely at home here, for our true home is elsewhere.

Ascension is not the end of the story. He also gave his disciples, his followers the task of completing his work, by preaching the Good News to the rest of the world.

In his book 'The song of the Bird, Anthony de Mello tells this story. He puts it in the first person to give it added impact. He says:

On the street I saw a small girl cold and shivering in a thin dress with little hope for a decent meal. I became angry and said to God.' why do you permit this? For a while God said nothing. That night he replied quite suddenly, `I certainly did something about it. I made you`.

De Mello`s story makes the same point that today's feast does. On the day of his ascension 2000 years ago, Jesus passed on to us the responsibility of completing the work that he began on earth. He passed on to us the responsibility of completing God's kingdom on earth. You and I, in this church today share this responsibility. Not one of us is exempt. And Jesus is counting on us. But each one of us must decide how we can best carry out our part in this responsibility.

Let us close with a prayer: Lord Jesus on this feast of your ascension into heaven, give us new eyes to see your face in the faces of those who are in need. Give us new ears to hear your voice in the voices of those who cry out in pain. Give us new tongues to tell your story to those who have never heard it. Give us new hearts to share your love with those who have not experienced it.

Reflection

Without the Ascension, there is no Pentecost.

The message of the Ascension is a powerful one. It reminds us that Jesus, the human incarnation of God on earth, was limited to a specific time and place in history. Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the church. Despite the physical limitations of his life on earth, Jesus ensured that his message and ministry would continue through those he had taught, the apostles and evangelists.

He ministers through its prophets and pastors. In and through the church, Jesus continues to heal and to comfort; to forgive and to include. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone; we have each other. Together we make up the new body of Christ.

Knowing that the disciples would need time to grieve and come to terms with all that had occurred in a relatively short space of time, Jesus promised that the Spirit would come upon them in the days to come. That visiting of the Spirit upon the disciples at Pentecost was the motivation to set about doing what Jesus had charged them to do.

A witness in a court of law is called to give evidence about a matter; to 'testify' to the truth of what they have seen or what they know to be true. Some people are very good at being a 'witness' to their faith by testifying to others about what they believe. Many others provide witness to their faith by simply living what they believe. Living a life based on Christian principles, including regular prayer and worship in your life, working for justice in the world and taking time to celebrate the beauty of everyday life is a powerful witness to others.

Without the Ascension, there is no Pentecost. Together we await the fullness of this body.

Why? Because it is his wish that we may one day possess the throne he has prepared for us. Since his Heart is full of love for us, let us ask him to bless and protect us.
