Reflection

MSC Missions

In our first reading we have the grim words of vengeance, resentment,

anger, hate, dissolution and death. All these things seem to ring true in our world today. However, the reading ends on a high note; "Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour illwill; remember the covenant ..." If we remember these and live by them, in the Spirit, we can overcome and live with all the rest. Our Psalm reminds us; "The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion."

Our MSC Mission Office aims to live by this kindness and mercy, to show the compassion of Jesus Christ. Many people are much worse off than we are, even in this difficult time of the pandemic. These people often lack water or the water is polluted or distant; they strive to find money for school fees and material; they lack health facilities; often our missionaries struggle with everyday needs and the demands of their pastoral work. On top of this they have the problems of Covid and Ebola. For social and cultural reasons, they live close together in extended families and villages, making pandemic preventative measures impossible.


