From the Side Desk...

Jesus was in gentile territory. He took the deaf man with a speech impediment aside; a movement illustrating a journey and growth in faith. It is the only miracle or healing narrative within the gospel described as taking place gradually.

Though the deaf person's ear was opened, this was more than simply physical healing. This person responded to Jesus' command to be open. He heard and clearly understood what was being said to him, then spoke and bore witness to the conversion and healing that happened to him and within him.

As he so often did, Jesus instructed the people not to speak of the miracle. Perhaps, to prevent the misinterpretation and a narrow understanding of his ministry and mission. To help me understand why he did this, the question I found myself reflecting on was 'do we have faith because we want to be healed, or are we healed because we have faith?' While some may not see a distinction between the two parts of this statement, I see the first half as a narrowing of the definition of healing; something that Jesus also tried to avoid. This is when we define ours (or others) ailment and what we believe needs healing. Often, if these remain unfulfilled, we may start to question or doubt our faith. The second part of the statement is faith without conditions. It allows for what needs healing rather than what we want healed. Faith and an openness to God leads to a holistic experience of healing. It relinquishes control; a control we never ever possessed to begin with. From personal experience, this often changes us. As we slowly embrace the gift that is human life, and the frailty of our own, faith draws us closer to God and beyond ourselves to care for the other. It is the journey of conversion. It is mission. It is what Jesus asks of his listeners and followers. It is Jesus, who hung dying on the cross, but did not ask God to heal him. He chose instead, to entrust himself to God and so bring healing to all of us.

Each of us has personal struggles we would like to change or heal. In this Sunday's gospel, the person's ear was opened before his tongue was unbound. Perhaps, this is the message for us this week. Our first call is to clearly hear and understand Jesus. Then, the unbinding follows.

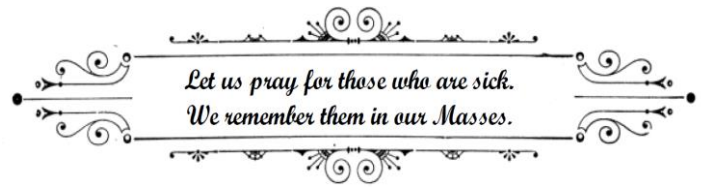

Today's readings offer us a message of hope — God is with us and wants to heal us. The Gospel presents us with the story of the profound physical healing of a deaf man with a speech impediment. Jesus took the man off by himself, touched his ears and his tongue, then proclaimed, "Be opened!" Immediately he was healed.

God is a compassionate God who sees our physical needs. Often, we are blind and deaf to God in our lives. We miss countless opportunities to see God working in our day-to-day moments—through our loved ones, our community, or even a stranger. We miss the quiet voice of Jesus in our hearts telling us to choose Him instead of sin, respond in love instead of anger, or care for someone else in a moment instead of ourselves.

These are how we need to be spiritually healed. And the scriptures remind us that God is with us and wants to heal us. Let us pray that our eyes and our ears might "be open" to God's workings, words, and promptings in our lives.
