WHO DO PEOPLE SAY THAT I AM?

Priest was visiting homes one day. He knocked on one door and after a while a little girl appeared at the door. Since he knew her from the church, he asked her, "Sweetie, do you know who I am?" The little girl looking at the kitchen area of the house called her mother saying, "Mom, there is a man at our door. He doesn't know who he is."

Some questions embarrass us. Especially if they are personal. The answers might hurt the questioner. "Do you love me?" "No." "Do you miss me?" "No."

There are academic questions and personal questions. We see that in the two questions Jesus asks his disciples. "Who do people say that I am? It is safer to answer this question. "Well, some say..." But when Jesus gets personal: "And you, who do you, say that I am?" Now Jesus gets to the core of their hearts.

If you keep things general, everyone speaks. If you get personal, then silence takes over. "Who do you say that I am?" It is a question with seven words to define Jesus' identity. By this Jesus is asking: What does my life and presence mean to your life? What is your understanding of my mission? Why do you follow me wherever I go? Why do you listen to my preaching and teaching? What do I mean to you?

Peter sums up his perfect answer to Jesus' question in four words: "You are the Messiah." As we know there is head knowledge and heart knowledge. Peter had heart knowledge.

Why did Jesus ask this question to his disciples? Jesus wanted to test his disciples' knowledge of Him.

Knowledge is a powerful force. Knowledge has changed the course of history. A doctor's knowledge saves lives; a pilot's knowledge ensures the safe return of the travellers; a teacher's knowledge helps to dispel the ignorance of the students. Christ tests the knowledge of His disciples, because He knew how critical their knowledge of Him would be for the success of their mission as well as ours. The knowledge of Jesus as Lord and personal Saviour needs to become a living, personal experience for each Christian drawing each of us to loving response.



Stewardship

Jesus addresses His disciples saying, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." We are Jesus' disciples, and He is speaking those same words to us here and now. This means we are called to share in Christ's sufferings by taking up our cross and following Him daily.

We can start by making a firm resolution to follow Christ today, here and now, and renewing that resolution each day when we rise. This requires time with Him each day — speaking and listening.

We should also strive to pick up our crosses each day with Christ by our side. Instead of avoiding these sufferings or complaining about them, we are called to carry them with Christ, allowing Him to transform us through them.

If we live life constantly focused on us, we will ultimately lose ourselves, but if we surrender our lives for Christ and His mission, we will gain eternal life and become more alive than we could have ever imagined. This takes daily commitment and requires endurance in our faith, which can only be done through active discipleship.
