Reflection

Are You Jealous or Zealous?

One young man approaches a good looking girl in a mall and asked, "You know, I have lost my girlfriend here in the mall. Can you talk to me for a couple of minutes?" "Why?" she asks. "Because, every time I talk to a beautiful girl, my girlfriend appears out of nowhere." Today's Scripture readings give us a strong warning against jealousy, intolerance and giving scandal.

Jealousy can be a horrible thing. For us, as humans, it is often fatal. Human jealousy can quickly get out of hand. That's what happened to Saul. He was the first king of Israel. He wanted to destroy David but he wound up destroying himself.

Some of history's worst sins can be attributed to jealousy. The first murder was committed because of jealousy. Cain was jealous that Abel's offering was accepted by God and his was not Jesus was crucified because of the jealousy of the religious leaders. In the gospel today the disciples are jealous of a stranger expelling demons. Remember at one point the disciples were jealous of John and James trying to get a spiritual promotion. The workers in the gospel were jealous that those who came last and worked less hours were getting the same wages as the first comers who had worked long hours. Then the landlord asked: "Are you jealous because I am just."

God does not tolerate jealousy. Jesus corrects his disciples about their jealousy about others preaching. How do we understand God's jealousy? When God says that he is "jealous", it implies no disorder. Unlike human jealousy that destroys, God's jealousy puts things back in order.

A positive word for jealousy is "zeal". The two words come from the same Greek root. We hear about Jesus' all-consuming zeal in the cleansing of the Temple. To remove barriers between God and his people, Jesus tips over tables, scatters coins and stampedes cattle. He unleashes some chaos in order to get our attention. Such zeal, such jealousy is creative. We need to be zealous Christians.


