Reflection

Hypocrisy

Throughout the gospels, what Jesus appears to abhor more than anything else is hypocrisy. His harshest condemnation of the scribes and the Pharisees is that they are hypocrites. In today's Gospel, whilst Jesus hates the scribes' parading around and claiming honour that is not their due, what really sees him condemn them is their mistreatment of widows 'while making a show of lengthy prayers'. We cannot praise God in prayer while at the same time mistreating our neighbour. That is hypocrisy!

Hypocrisy is the practice of engaging in the same behavior or activity for which one criticizes another or the practice of claiming to have moral standards or beliefs to which one's own behavior does not conform.

We accuse one person of doing exactly what we are doing but believe that it is somehow "different" when that person does it. It is typically caused by an inflated sense of ego and self-righteousness, coupled with an inability to be humble.

The problem with trying to live by absolute moral principles is that the more positive you are about one thing, the less positive you are about its opposite. If you really love justice, you really hate injustice. If you judge judgment to be bad, you're judging. If you're kind to one person, you're unkind to others since kindness takes effort — you can't be kind to everyone all at once.

At the root of hypocrisy is fear and low self-esteem. We use hypocrisy to avoid looking at our shortcomings and figure out our part in it. Our belief is more just, more noble, and sincerer.

Instead of being afraid to show our human side, we need to embrace it. At the root of hypocrisy is a desire to be loved and accepted without judgment.

Our actions are an extension of our prayer. We cannot celebrate the Eucharist on Sundays and fail to live it the rest of the week!

Stewardship


Gracious Stewards

Both of these women are in desperate situations — one in the midst of famine with a child to care for, and the other clearly impoverished. Yet, each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them.

Their strength came from knowing who they are, and Whose they are. These women must have known their security would not come from a good life insurance policy or connections to someone with a hidden storehouse of flour.

These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the resources God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had. And acting as stewards made them gracious, generous and mighty indeed.


