Reflection

Hope and Perseverance

In today's Gospel we get a very vivid picture of how the end of the world might break in upon us. It's clear that Mark thought it was going to happen in the lifetime of some of his hearers. It didn't, and many generations later we're still waiting. Today, as in Mark's time, many people approach the future and change with fear and apprehension.

The reign of God breaks in upon us regularly. Every time we are kind rather than cruel, patient rather than intolerant, generous rather than selfish, beautiful rather than ugly, the reign of God bursts into our lives. We believe that every day more good is done in the world than evil; else this world would destroy itself. And we hold that the source of all love is Christ.

In the midst of despair and fear, the followers of Jesus are challenged to remember the teachings of the one they follow. This passage is written for them as an encouragement to not give up in the face of what appears to be overwhelming odds. It is a call to hope.

Although we can understand the context in which it was originally written, we are also challenged to apply its message of hope and perseverance to our own lives.

As Christian people we are called to be optimistic and hopeful as we approach the future. We know that God is good, that God loves us unconditionally and that God has a dream for us. That is the simple basis of Christian hope.

The care of God will not pass away. Each of us is in the book of life – with a job to do. Something written for all of us to make this world a better place. We are called to be friends of the earth...friends of all people...friends of the poor. That's redemption, Jesus and us working in unison.

Face masks are no longer required.


Future of Catholicism in Australia.
