FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT 3 December 2023

Reflection

Receiving Jesus Anew

In today's gospel passage, Jesus emphasizes the importance of staying alert and watchful, comparing it to a master leaving his house and entrusting his servants with specific tasks. The call to "watch" is a call to remain vigilant and attentive to the signs of the times. It is important for each of us to stay awake. Awake to what is happening around us in the world and awake to what is happening within us.

One of the great challenges to faith today is the complacency that has taken hold of many in our society. In times of comfort and convenience, the urgency of faith may fade, especially in a culture driven by instant gratification. The rapid pace of modern life, characterized by instant communication and quick satisfaction, can make the patient and reflective work of faith appear burdensome.

However, the call to stay awake during Advent is a reminder that faith is an ongoing journey, not a fleeting experience. The complacency that might arise in comfortable times is precisely what Jesus warns against. It's during these moments of ease that the call to faith becomes more crucial, as it requires a deliberate effort to stay connected with God and to continue the work of bringing about the Kingdom.

The comparison with Advent as a time of preparation is apt. Advent is not just a ritualistic observance but a profound opportunity to prepare our hearts to receive Jesus anew into our lives. The call to stay awake echoes the sentiment of active anticipation and readiness for the coming of the Lord, not just as a historical event but as a continuous presence in our lives.

The clarion call to stay awake calls us to be vigilant. It challenges the prevailing complacency and encourages a deeper engagement with faith, especially in a world that often values immediacy over contemplation. As we enter the season of Advent, the call to stay awake serves as a timely reminder to actively participate in the ongoing work of bringing the Kingdom of God into our lives and the world. Advent: Action in Waiting

Stay Awake – Be Alert

The message of Advent is, be alert, vigilant and industrious, so that the arrival of the Christ child will be and experience of overwhelming joy. What we are in fact celebrating is the awe-inspiring humility of God, and no amount of familiarity with the trappings of Christmas should ever blind us to its quiet but explosive significance. For Christians believe that so great is God's love and concern for humanity that God became one of us.

Advent is a time of waiting. Waiting for God to be born anew in us. The secret of waiting is the faith that the seed has been planted, that something has begun. We can only really wait if what we are waiting for has already begun for us. Active waiting means to be present fully to the moment, to be awake. A waiting person is someone who is present to the moment, who believes that this moment is *the* moment. So waiting is never a movement from nothing to something. It is always a movement from


