SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT **10 December 2023**

Reflection

The wilderness is a place of encounter.

Today's gospel places John the Baptist in the wilderness, heralding the coming of Jesus. This image reinforces the idea of the wilderness as a space where profound encounters with God take place. John's clothing of camel's hair and his diet of locusts and wild honey evoke the image of a prophet in the wilderness, reminiscent of Elijah. This deliberate association suggests a continuity with the prophetic tradition and underscores the wilderness as a space where individuals are set apart for a divine purpose.

The act of baptizing in the Jordan River becomes symbolic of a cleansing and preparation for the imminent arrival of the Messiah. The act of baptism, traditionally associated with repentance, emphasizes the transformative nature of the wilderness experience. It serves as a rite of passage, a symbolic washing away of the old self in anticipation of the new. This reinforces the idea that the wilderness is not only a physical place but also a metaphorical space for personal and spiritual preparation. A place where obstacles are removed, and hearts are made ready for the divine encounter.

Furthermore, the wilderness is presented as a liminal space, a threshold between the familiar and the unknown. People from Jerusalem and all Judea flock to the wilderness to be baptized by John, signifying a collective recognition of the need for spiritual preparation and renewal.

The wilderness is a sacred space where individuals undergo a transformative process, shedding the old and preparing for the new. It serves as a place of communal acknowledgment and anticipation, echoing the timeless truth that the wilderness is not just a physical terrain but a symbolic realm where we encounter God and prepare ourselves for the unfolding of divine purposes in our lives.

Advent is a wilderness time when we prepare for the feast of the Incarnation - God becoming one of us.


