Reflection

God is revealed in the Ordinary

The feast of the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus to humankind. The wise men are the representatives of humanity bearing witness to this revelation. However, the Epiphany celebrates the revelation of Jesus as not only the Messiah of Israel but the Saviour of the whole world. Interestingly, in this gospel that emphasises the 'Jewish-ness' of Jesus, the witnesses to the birth are gentiles from a foreign land. Their inclusion is a powerful declaration that the revelation of Jesus is for all people.

One great idea of the biblical revelation is that God is manifest in the ordinary, in the actual, in the daily, in the now, in the concrete incarnations of life. Our experiences of ordinary life will transform us if we are willing to experience them fully.

God's revelations are through the concrete and specific. Spirituality is not a Platonic world of ideas and theories about which you can be right or wrong. Revelation is not something you measure, but something—or Someone—you meet! This pattern of incarnation reaches its fullness in one small place on the planet, in one short period of history, in one very ordinary man named Jesus.

The biblical revelation is saying that we are already spiritual beings; we just don't know it yet, and we have to be shocked into it. The Bible tries to let us in on the secret, by revealing God in ordinary human affairs and conflicts.

The Incarnation proclaims that matter and spirit have never been separate. Jesus came to tell us that these two seemingly different worlds are—and always have been—one. We couldn't even imagine it until God put all of this together in one body (see Ephesians 2:11-22), one life (1 John 1:1-2), and one shocking epiphany.

It was wonderful to catch up with so many parishioners at the weekend Masses. It seemed like I had only been away a few weeks, rather than three years. Although I was sad to leave the parish of Randwick, only having just got to know the parishioners, it is also good to be back in Canberra.

When my provincial asked me to move to Kippax, it was with the understanding that there would be two priests residing in the presbytery. Since then Fr Chung Minh Tran MSC has been appointed to Kippax, who will take up his appointment in May this year. When I considered that there would be three priests at Kippax while Charnwood remains without a priest, I decided to offer my services to Charnwood. After discussing this with the Vicar General, and with the approval of the MSC provincial, I will move to St Thomas Aquinas Charnwood and administer to the sacramental needs of the parish.

Taking up residence and ministry at Charnwood is an interim arrangement. It is not an official appointment and therefore there is no set period to my tenure there. For me, the good news is that I will continue to be in the neighbourhood and hope to keep in contact with the parishioners of Kippax.
