Reflection

Betrayal

The scene at the Last Supper unfolds with a sense of solemnity and impending doom. Jesus shares the bread and wine, foreshadowing his imminent sacrifice, while simultaneously revealing the betrayal that will come from within his closest circle. The disciples, unaware of their own capabilities, pledge unwavering loyalty, echoing Peter's fervent declaration, "Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you."

Peter is an interesting character in the gospels. He is one of the first of the disciples to be called; Jesus changes his name and places great trust in him; he is witness to the most significant moments of Jesus' life; he is able to profess his faith in Jesus as the Christ and yet it is he who denies even knowing Jesus.

As events progress the narrative intensifies, and the betrayal unfolds. Jesus is arrested, tried, and condemned to death. The cock crows not once, but twice, as Peter fulfills the prophecy, and in Jesus' hour of need denies him three times. This moment encapsulates the tension between human weakness and divine providence, illustrating how even the most devout can stumble in the face of adversity.

Peter's fervent avowal of loyalty to Jesus is matched by the frailty of his resolve and his susceptibly to fear and weakness. This theme invites introspection into our own vulnerabilities and the times when we, like Peter, falter in our commitment to our beliefs.

We might have thought that Peter was Jesus' most loyal and faithful follower, yet it is he who can't stand up and claim that he was a follower of Jesus. Is it any wonder that sometimes it is difficult for us today.

Yet, amidst the darkness of betrayal and denial, there is a glimmer of hope. Jesus, the epitome of forgiveness and grace, extends mercy even to those who abandon him. Despite Peter's denial, Jesus never wavers in his love for him, ultimately restoring him and commissioning him to feed his sheep.

Jesus turned and looked at Peter

Every person at some time in their life has fallen. Many have fallen many times; few, few times. And who of us can fail to shudder at the tale of Peter's guilt? When we read the story for ourselves, we feel an almost unconscious sympathy with Peter, as if his story has happened in our own lives. Those of us who know the heart's deceit would surely find it difficult to judge this man – this man who had lived so long in the inner circle of fellowship with Christ, whose eyes were used to seeing miracles, who witnessed the glory of the transfiguration; this man whose ears were full of the most solemn words the world had ever heard, whose heart was still warm with Communion-table thoughts.

Peter's betrayal of Jesus is a life changing moment. But there is something in Peter's life that is much greater than his sin. It is his repentance. We easily relate to Peter in his sin, but few of us grasp the wonder of his repentance. When the cock crows for the second time Jesus turns and looks at Peter. In the depths of sin Peter never thought of turning. Jesus' look rents Peter's heart as lightening could not and melted into his soul. That one look laid a spell upon his soul. The only sermon needed to anyone who sins is that the Lord turns first, with a look of love.


Stewardship
