"Peace be with you"

The phrase "Peace be with you" that Jesus utters in today's gospel carries immense significance not only for the disciples of that time but also for Christians in the 21st century.

The context of Jesus' greeting is crucial. The disciples were filled with fear, doubt, and confusion following Jesus' crucifixion. They were struggling to make sense of the events that had transpired and were uncertain about the future. In this moment of uncertainty and turmoil, Jesus' words "Peace be with you" served as a source of comfort, reassurance, and hope. It challenges us to actively work towards justice, harmony, and understanding among all people.

In a world marked by division, conflict, and injustice, the message of "Peace be with you" calls us to be peacemakers in our communities and beyond. It invites us to bridge divides, seek common ground, and promote dialogue and understanding. This requires humility, empathy, and a willingness to step out of our comfort zones.

We also need more volunteers for the



God cares about our suffering and pain

The image Jesus left with the world, the cross, the most common image in the Christian religion, is proof that God cares about our suffering and pain. He died of it. Dorothy Sayers says:

For whatever reason God chose to make humanity as it is – limited and suffering and subject to sorrows and death – he had the honesty and courage to take his own medicine. Whatever game he is playing with his creation, he has kept his own rules and played fair. He can exact nothing from humanity that he has not exacted from himself. He has himself gone through the whole human experience, from the trivial irritations of family life and the cramping restrictions of hard work and lack of money to the worst horrors of pain and humiliation, defeat despair, and death. When he was a man, he played the man. He was born in poverty and died in disgrace and thought it well worthwhile.

Stewardship

Jesus, the centre of our lives

Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus should be the centre of our lives. This passage begins with two disciples realizing Jesus had just appeared to them.

To recognize Jesus' appearances in our lives, we need to know Him. And the best way to know the Lord is to spend time with Him. It can start with just 10 minutes of quiet prayer a day and increasing that each week. Our goal should be to carve out time each day, in a quiet space, for just you and the Lord.

The disciples recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. You, too, can better know the Lord through the sacraments, most especially the Holy Mass. What better way to grow in intimacy with Christ than to receive Him frequently or to go talk to Him in front of the Blessed Sacrament?

Take time to think about what Christ has done for you and the changes you should make in your daily life to help you grow closer to Him.
