Called to a different way of Living

Today, Jesus presents a profound lesson that challenges the common understanding of greatness and power. The disciples, much like us today, were caught up in concerns about status and position, debating who among them was the greatest. Jesus, aware of their preoccupations, redirects their thinking by stating that true greatness is not about being first, but about being last and serving others.

This teaching is countercultural, both in the time of Jesus and in our world today, where success is often measured by how much power, influence, or wealth one can accumulate. Society tends to celebrate those who climb the ladder of success, often at the expense of others, valuing individuals based on their achievements, possessions, and status.

However, Jesus flips this notion on its head by advocating for a leadership that is rooted in humility and service. He invites His disciples, and us, to redefine what it means to be powerful. True power, according to Jesus, lies not in lording over others but in uplifting them. When we serve others, we honour their dignity, give them respect, and, in a way, empower them. By placing ourselves last, we create space for others to be seen, heard, and valued.

Jesus' call to servanthood is a reminder that our worth is not determined by our rank or achievements but by our willingness to serve others with love and humility. It is in serving others that we truly reflect the heart of Christ and participate in His mission of bringing God's kingdom to earth—a kingdom where the last are first, and the humble are exalted.

In this passage, Jesus also uses the example of a child, one who had little status or power in society, to illustrate His point. By welcoming a child, we welcome Jesus Himself, for in caring for the least among us, we are living out the very essence of the Gospel.

We are challenged to examine our own lives and attitudes. In a world obsessed with self-promotion and competition, Jesus' words call us to a different way of living—a way that values others above ourselves and finds true greatness in humble service.



Humility of Heart

In a spirit of faith, we will follow that other lesson our Lord gives us: "Learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart" (Mt. 11:29). Let us not forget that gentleness wins hearts and that, according to the Holy Spirit, the world belongs to the gentle (Mt 5: 4).

Let us remember that humility attracts grace, and that the acceptance of our own humiliation raises us up to God. These two virtues must be the distinctive mark of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. To acquire them we should: try to keep out of sight of others what God deigns to do in us and through us. And if this is not always possible, we should rightly attribute everything to God's mercy and to the merits of others. The one who possesses this humility possesses every good, but the one who lacks it, lacks everything. "He resists the proud, gives his grace to the humble."
