We belong to God's eternal kingdom

Both society and the church recognise the family as the cornerstone of society. And as the cornerstone, it lays the foundation for the support system for the wider society.

Since Vatican II there has been a tendency in the church to refer to the family as the *domestic church*. For Catholic Christians, family is the first place where faith, virtues, and moral values are taught and passed down.

The church has been perhaps the most obvious warrior on behalf of the family in the past century. But there's been an unfortunate side-effect to how church leaders and theologians have presented the church's teachings about the family in recent decades: the tendency has been to stress the similarity between the family and the church, even to the point of blurring the boundary between them.

Dr Mehmet Çiftçi in his article *The Family is Not a Church*, states comparing the family with the church has watered down the church's political nature. The article warns against conflating the family with the church. Today's gospel can be seen as maintaining a necessary distinction between earthly family bonds and the greater spiritual realities of the kingdom. Jesus' teaching about marriage acknowledges its sacredness but also subtly points beyond it. When Jesus declares, "What God has joined together, let no one separate" (Mark 10:9), he affirms marriage's divine origin, yet later in the gospel, Jesus speaks of a future where marriage is no longer necessary (Mark 12:25). The family, then, is a vital earthly institution but not an eternal or salvific one.

Furthermore, when Jesus welcomes children and declares that the kingdom of God belongs to those like them, he highlights the need for humility and openness to God's grace. This challenges any notion of the family as a saving community on its own. The family can nurture faith, but salvation comes from Christ and participation in the broader body of the church.

Çiftçi's article critiques the modern tendency to treat the family as a "domestic church" in a way that risks confusing its purpose with that of the church itself. Jesus' teachings in Mark 10 echo this caution: while family is important, it must not be idolized or seen as the ultimate realization of God's kingdom. Instead, both family and church point to a greater reality—our belonging to God's eternal kingdom.

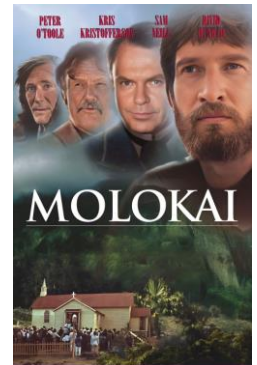

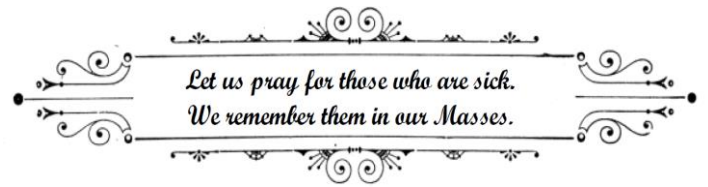
