Reflection

Follow the path of Humble Love

Epiphany: this word indicates the manifestation of the Lord, who, as Saint Paul tells us in the second reading makes himself known to all the nations, today represented by the Magi. The Feast of the Epiphany signifies the revelation of Jesus not only as the Messiah of Israel but also as the Saviour of the entire world. The emphasis on the inclusion of the Gentiles mirrors the broader theme of the Epiphany – that the revelation of Jesus transcends cultural, ethnic, and geographical boundaries.

Pope Francis says, "We need to arise, to get up from our sedentary lives and prepare for a journey. He says we need to be like the Magi, who not only see the light of the star but follow it. Pope Francis tells us; "we are asked to imitate the Magi. They do not debate; they set out. They do not stop to look, but enter the house of Jesus. They do not put themselves at the centre, but bow down before the One who is the centre. They do not remain glued to their plans, but are prepared to take other routes." We need to arise, to get up from our sedentary lives and prepare for a journey.

In order to find Jesus, we also need to take a different route, to follow a different path, his path, the path of humble love. And we have to persevere. Today's Gospel ends by saying that the Magi, after encountering Jesus, "left for their own country by another road" (Mt 2:12). Another road, different from that of Herod. An alternative route than that of the world, like the road taken by those who surround Jesus at Christmas: Mary and Joseph, the shepherds. Like the Magi, they left home and became pilgrims on the paths of God. For only those who leave behind their worldly attachments and undertake a journey find the mystery of God.

Christmas Season

The Christmas Mystery

The Christmas mystery has two parts: the nativity and the epiphany. In the first we commemorate God's humble entrance into human life, the emergence and birth of the holy, and in the second its manifestation to the world, the revelation of the supernatural made in that life. The first only happens in order that the second may happen, and the second cannot happen without the first. Christ is a Light to lighten the Gentiles as well as the glory of his people Israel. Beholding God's glory is only half our job. The mysteries must be brought forth in our souls as well. The birth of Christ in our souls is for a purpose beyond ourselves: it is because his manifestation in the world must be through us. The goal of our prayer and the goal of our hidden life should itself become more and more of a prayer, which is "union with God." Union with God means every bit of our human nature transfigured in Christ, woven up into his creative life and activity, absorbed into his redeeming purpose, heart, soul, mind, and strength. Each time it happens it means that one of God's creatures has achieved its destiny.
