SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 14 January 2024

Reflection

"Here am I, Lord."

Today's readings offer a unique glimpse into the relationship between God and humanity, revealing a common thread of surrender and willingness to do the will of the Lord.

The story of Samuel speaks of an awakening of divine communication. As a young boy, Samuel hears the call of God in the stillness of the night, responding with the humble words, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel's openness to God's call becomes a model for all believers, illustrating the importance of attentiveness and receptivity to the divine voice.

The psalmist, in Psalm 39, reflects on the brevity of life and the transient nature of human endeavours. Amidst the contemplation of mortality, the psalmist acknowledges the sovereignty of God and expresses a desire to align with divine purpose. "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will" becomes a plea for guidance and a recognition of God's authority over one's existence.

St Paul addresses the Corinthian community regarding the sanctity of the body. The verses emphasize that our bodies are not our own but are temples of the Holy Spirit. The call to glorify God in our bodies echoes the theme of surrender and obedience: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will" takes on a physical dimension, reminding believers of the responsibility to honour God through their actions and choices.

The Gospel of John introduces the disciples' encounter with Jesus. The disciples respond to Jesus' invitation to "come and see", like Samuel, with readiness and openness. Their journey signifies a willingness to follow and learn.

A harmonious melody emerges from these readings—a melody of surrender, attentiveness, and a deep desire to align one's will with God's. May we respond to God's call with; "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will." And may this refrain guide our daily reflections and actions, inviting us to a life shaped by divine purpose and devoted obedience.

Initially, Samuel responds, "Here I am," but thinks it was Eli who called him. The idea of being a servant and the willingness to serve are what may be trials for us in terms of how we live. When Jesus says, "Come follow me," as He does to us, do we hear Him, and even more importantly do we respond, and do we follow? In order to do that properly we have to be prepared to serve Him and others. Thus, like Samuel, we need to listen, and then we need to serve. At a recent papal audience, Pope Francis said, "Love and charity are service, helping others, serving others. When you forget yourself and think of others, this is love!"
