"Travelling Light, Listening Deeply"

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples with a clear and simple instruction: *take nothing with you for the journey.* No purse, no bag, no sandals. Go vulnerable. Go dependent. Go ready to receive.

In a world like ours—obsessed with self-sufficiency, backup plans, and protective gear—Jesus' instructions feel almost reckless. Who travels without a phone, wallet, or itinerary today? And yet, perhaps that is exactly the point. Jesus invites his disciples, and us, to travel light—not just in terms of possessions, but in terms of ego, control, and preconceived expectations. He calls us to rely instead on the hospitality of others: on openness, relationship, and trust.

This is radical in any culture, but especially in ours, where independence is prized and asking for help can be seen as a weakness. Yet Jesus points to hospitality as the true litmus test of spiritual readiness. *If a household welcomes you, bless them.* The warmth of hospitality, the courage to make space for another, becomes the doorway through which the Gospel can enter. And if that welcome is not offered? Jesus is remarkably clear: *Move on.* Shake the dust from your feet.

There's deep wisdom in that. So often, we are tempted to keep pushing where the door is closed—to convince, to explain, to fix, to force. But Jesus tells us not to waste our energy where it isn't received. There is no shame in walking away from spaces that cannot hold your message. In fact, it may be a sacred act of respect—to yourself and to those not yet ready. As someone once said, "You can't force a seed to sprout before its time."

When the seventy-two return, full of joy, Jesus gently grounds them. Do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, he says, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven. Our deepest joy should not come from visible success or recognition, but from the quiet assurance that we are known, loved, and sent by God.


