The Good Samaritan

Jesus' original audience would have been *shocked* by his choice of a Samaritan as the hero of this parable—not because it simply illustrated enmity between groups, but because it cut directly across the expected roles and social norms. In the cultural setting of Jesus' time, a Samaritan would have been the *least likely* person to be cast as the one who fulfills God's law of love. The priest and Levite—figures associated with religious duty and social standing—fail to act. Their actions are shaped by ritual purity codes and social expectations. The Samaritan, however, acts not out of duty or conformity, but from *compassion*.

And that is the heart of the story. Compassion.

In Luke's Gospel, compassion is not a sentimental feeling—it's a call to action that overrides cultural, religious, and social boundaries. The Samaritan *sees* the wounded man, is *moved with pity*, and *draws near*. He acts concretely, generously, and at personal cost. His care is detailed and sustained, extending beyond the initial moment of rescue. Jesus lifts up this compassionate response as the model for how we are to love our neighbour—not in theory, but in the grit and complexity of real life.

When the lawyer asks, "Who is my neighbour?" he is looking for boundaries—trying to define who *deserves* his love. Jesus turns the question on its head by instead asking, "Who was neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" It is not about defining others, but about *becoming* a neighbour through compassionate action.

The commandment at the end is simple and confronting: "Go and do the same yourself." This is not a story we are meant to admire from a distance. It is a story we are meant to *enter*. Jesus does not just tell us to think differently; he calls us to *act* differently—to allow compassion to interrupt our routines, challenge our prejudices, and guide our responses.

This Gospel invites us to a deeper, more courageous discipleship—one where compassion has the final word.

Compassion

Our love of neighbour should be tenderhearted and compassionate. The Samaritan should be our model. Along the road he meets a wounded man, half dead, stripped, dying of hunger. He is stirred at the sight, and his heart touched with compassion (Lk. 10:33). Let us not close our heart to pity, when along life's road we come across a person wounded by sorrow, bruised by ingratitude, calumny, prostrate in the mud of a disorderly life, or a poor person lacking everything, or a needy family. Like the Samaritan, let us draw near to these unfortunate people, and do everything in our power to comfort them. Do we conduct ourselves in this way? De we not on the contrary imitate the hardness of heat of the men in the gospel towards the wounded man?
