#### **Leave room for Grace**

"All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." (Luke 14:11)

Jesus' message about humility is as relevant today as it was in the first century. In a world that often celebrates image, influence, and status, the temptation to prove our worth through comparison or competition is ever-present.

We long to belong, to be seen, to be valued—and yet, Jesus warns us not to chase honour for its own sake. He invites us instead to choose the lower place, not to diminish ourselves, but to leave room for grace to lift us in God's time.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus notices how guests at a dinner scramble for the places of prestige. His teaching isn't just about etiquette—it's about the heart. When we grasp at attention or recognition, we may gain temporary favour, but we risk losing touch with the deeper truth: our value is not in how others rank us, but in how we love, serve, and honour the dignity of others.

Jesus' parable also challenges us to examine how our sense of belonging is shaped. Sometimes we seek acceptance at any cost—even if it means ignoring the needs of others or contributing to systems of exclusion. When our comfort comes at the cost of someone else's struggle, the price is too high.

When our desire for fashion, luxury, or status depends on the underpayment or exploitation of workers, the price is too high. When we feel secure only by looking down on others, then we have lost sight of the Kingdom Jesus proclaimed.

Instead, Jesus calls us to live generously, welcoming those who cannot repay us, sharing our table with the poor, the excluded, and the forgotten. It is in this radical hospitality, born of humility, that we reflect the heart of God.

In God's Kingdom, greatness is found not in grasping for honour, but in giving it away.

### **In Close Proximity**

Whenever Jesus healed someone, he preferred to do it, not from a distance but in close proximity: "He stretched out his hand and touched him" (Mt 8:3). "He touched her hand" (Mt 8:15). "He touched their eyes" (Mt 9:29). Once he even stopped to cure a deaf man with his own saliva (cf. Mk 7:33), as a mother would do, so that people would not think of him as removed from their lives. "The Lord knows the fine science of the caress. In his compassion, God does not love us with words; he comes forth to meet us and, by his closeness, he shows us the depth of his tender love?
