Lifted Up

"The Son of Man must be lifted up... so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him." (John 3:14-15)

To gaze upon the Cross with reverence is a profoundly counter-cultural act. In the Roman world, the cross was not a sacred symbol but a grotesque instrument of state terror—a means of erasing enemies from memory and from life itself. Crucifixion was meant not only to kill but to humiliate, dehumanise, and obliterate. The bodies of the crucified were discarded without honour, their names forgotten, their legacies crushed.

And yet, in a stunning reversal, the early Christian community gradually came to see this instrument of annihilation as the sign of God's enduring love. In this passage from John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of being "lifted up"—a phrase that refers not only to his physical elevation on the cross but also to the spiritual exaltation of that very moment. Just as Moses lifted up the bronze serpent in the desert so that the Israelites might look upon it and be healed, so too must Jesus be lifted up—so that all who look to him with faith may be healed from sin and death.

This "lifting up" is not about glorifying suffering for its own sake. Rather, it is about the transformative power of divine love. In Jesus, God enters into the very heart of human pain, rejection, and mortality. The cross becomes the place where death is not the end but the threshold into life eternal.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." (John 3:16), reminds us that God's motive is not condemnation, but love: The Cross, once a tool of destruction, becomes the sign of that gift. It is not the violence of the cross that we venerate, but the love that willingly bore it.

To revere the Cross today is to proclaim that God can bring redemption out of what seems irredeemable. It is to say that even the darkest places in our lives can become sites of grace. It is to believe that nothing—not even death—can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.


