#### **Gratitude completes healing**

"The other nine, where are they?"

Jesus' question echoes through time, touching the heart of anyone who has ever forgotten to say thank you in the midst of joy or relief. Ten lepers are healed—ten lives transformed—yet only one, a Samaritan, turns back to give thanks.

It's easy to judge the nine who didn't return, but perhaps we should first recognize ourselves in them. When something beautiful happens—an answer to prayer, a new opportunity, the lifting of a burden—it's natural to rush forward, caught up in the excitement of what lies ahead. The lepers had so much to reclaim: families, homes, the touch of another hand, the dignity of being welcomed back into society. The whirlwind of restoration must have been overwhelming.

But in their haste to resume life, they forget to return to the source. They forget to *acknowledge the Giver*, focusing only on the gift.

The Samaritan, considered an outsider in so many ways, models the response of true faith: he turns back. His gratitude becomes worship. His healing is not just physical but spiritual—Jesus tells him, "Your faith has saved you."

This story invites us to slow down in our own lives. Where have we rushed forward, basking in blessings but forgetting their source? How often have we taken joy in answered prayers without returning to the One who answered them?

Gratitude doesn't just honour God; it completes our healing. In returning to Jesus, we're not only acknowledging what has been done for us—we're entering into deeper relationship with the One who does it.

So today, we might each pause and ask: What blessings have I received—and have I returned to give thanks?

Then he showed himself to her as an Ecce Homo, lacerated and disfigured, completely covered with wounds and bruises, his adorable blood flowing all over his body; he said to her in a sad and sorrowing voice: "Is there no one who would have pity on me, who would want to suffer with me and take part in my sorrow, in this pitiable state in which sinners put me, especially at present?"
