Persist in Prayer

The Parable of the Persistent Widow

When Jesus tells the story of the widow and the unjust judge, he does so not to compare God to the judge, but to make a sharp contrast. The judge in the parable is indifferent to justice and dismissive of human need. He neither fears God nor respects people, yet even he is moved to act—not out of compassion, but to avoid being worn down by the widow's persistence.

Jesus is saying: if even someone as hard-hearted as this judge can respond to repeated requests, how much more will God—who is just and merciful—respond to those who cry out to him day and night?

This parable is a reassurance that God is not distant, reluctant, or unwilling to help. God does not need to be badgered or manipulated into listening. Rather, God is attentive, loving, and desires justice. Jesus encourages his disciples to persist in prayer, not because they need to prove something to God, but because persistent prayer is a sign of deep trust and genuine need.

In times of delay or silence, it can feel as though our prayers go unanswered, but Jesus reminds us here that prayer is not only about results. It is also about remaining connected to God, expressing our longing, and nurturing our hope. Prayer, then, becomes less about changing God's mind and more about opening ourselves to God's presence and sustaining our faith.

The closing question of the parable stirs something deeper: "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" It is a challenge to remain faithful even when answers are slow in coming, even when justice feels distant. Persistent prayer keeps our hearts awake to God's justice, shapes our desires to align with God's will, and sustains our hope in a world that often feels unfair.

So let us not grow weary in prayer. Let us bring our needs, our longing for justice, and our cries for healing to the One who listens—not grudgingly, but with love—and who responds, not out of weariness, but with compassion and justice.


